"Keeping jazz alive"

Did you know there is a terrific opportunity to dance the afternoon away on the first Saturday of every month to a different live jazz band? The Bellingham Traditional Jazz Society is a group of enthusiastic jazz fans and musicians who support live traditional jazz in the Pacific Northwest for just this purpose.

Informal jazz socials are held every month, except July and August, at the VFW Hall at 625 N. State Street in Bellingham, just north of the Cliff House Restaurant. Each session showcases a different band from the

Pacific Northwest. The venue has fine acoustics, a large wooden dance floor, reasonable bar prices and snacks are available by donation.

The next dance is Saturday, January 8th from 2-5 PM. The featured band is the Thomas Harris Quartet featuring Grant Wilson on drums, Julianne Thoma on keyboard, Lyman Lipke on bass and Thomas Harris on sax and clarinet.

Plan on swings and foxtrots in every tempo imaginable!

The BTJS is a non-profit, tax-exempt society dedicated to preserving and promoting traditional jazz in the Bellingham area. If you enjoy listening and dancing to live traditional jazz, come along and check out the next dance. All ages are welcome.

Annual membership is \$14 for a single and \$21 for a couple. Admission is \$8 for members, \$10 for non-members and \$6 for students (with card). Membership includes a monthly newsletter, <u>Jazz Me News</u> and you'll find kinship with Traditional Jazz lovers all over the world with cruises, festivals held as close by as Vancouver and as far away as Japan.

In Washington alone you will find annual festivals in Port Angeles, Ocean Shores and Lacey. There are generally 3-4 dance floors running simultaneously in different venues at any given time during a festival. Or cross the border any Sunday afternoon and drive just 10 minutes to the Canadian Legion 240 at 2643 128th Street in South Surrey to dance with the White Rock Traditional Jazz Society. Take your pick: Become your favorite character, or the star who played them. Come as Clark Gable - or, come as Rhett Butler from Gone with the Wind. Be Bogey. Send up Marilyn. Or just your best Fred or Ginger self. We all have favorite idols. Show us yours. But remember to wear a mask.

Previous Masquerade Waltzes were sellouts, so reserve your 2011 ticket sooner rather than later. Expect a musical mix of swing, blues, fox trots, one-steps and waltzes of all tempos. Because this is a true masquerade, you will indeed need a mask for entry into the ballroom.

Do remember: This night is not a "Halloween party" in January. The Masquerade is theatre. You are the actor. Dare.

Consider starting your evening with gourmand-ish pleasure: The Tin Table proffers spirits, wines, Champagnes, and extraordinary small-plate meals beginning at 3 p.m. - just across the hall from the ballroom. It will satisfy all of your gastronomic whims until 1 a.m. For dinner reservations call 206-320-8458.

Seattle's Valse Café Orchestra coalesced in 1999 with a singular goal: to win the hearts of good dancers with post-modern renditions of dance hall classics. The ensemble's eclectic repertoire celebrates a romantic mélange of bygone eras and cultures: Paris in the thirties. Budapest in the 1890s. Yiddish melancholy. Gypsy perseverance. Old Vienna. Ragtime Manhattan. Disparate worlds indeed-all connected by the mesmerizing cadence of waltz.

The Valse Cafe Orchestra, as its name implies, plays a preponderance of waltzes, but the group's programs always feature a mix of swing tunes, fox trots, one steps, polkas, two steps and tangos to create moments of fantasy and romance.

The Century Ballroom, built in 1909 by the Odd Fellows Fraternity is absolutely lovely with the velvet drapes and the ornate detailing surrounding a fabulous- to- dance- on floor. Ticket sales will be balanced between leads and follows to ensure an enchanting evening for all.
