Evening in the Copper Room

On Saturday, October 15th, we'll be featuring music from the Harrison Hot Springs Copper Room all evening... music recorded by the Jones Boys for the past 30 years and recordings from The Copper Room Orchestra dating back to 1943. Elegant Cocktail attire is suggested and we will be selling 'mocktails' as a fundraiser to support future events.



If you aren't familiar with Harrison Hot Springs, a favorite of many USA Dance members, you're missing a seldom seen opportunity to dine and dance 7 nights a week in a historic hotel just 90 minutes from Bellingham. The original resort, named the Saint Alice Hotel, ran from 1886 to 1920, and was unfortunately destroyed by a fire. In 1926 the hotel was rebuilt and became the Harrison Hot Springs Resort, run by Vancouver businessmen.

From 1943 to 1945, the hotel was a Convalescent Hospital for the Canadian Department of National Defense. From 1949 to 1998, The Harrison Hotel was owned by United Distillers, Seagram's Corporation, Wosks and the Itoman Corporation of Japan. Today it is owned by Delaware North Company which also manages the Queen Mary in Long Beach CA.

From the beginning, the Copper Room has been the scene of live music for ballroom dancing. Presidents and Premiers have stayed and dined in this little village at the foot of the enormous Harrison Lake.



Can't wait until October 15th? Come join us at Harrison on September 24th for dinner and dancing at the 2nd annual "Celebrate Karen's 39th Birthday (Again)" Event. 
Good thing we packed our dancing shoes! We honestly expected to have a hard time finding a place to dance and almost left them behind. So imagine
