Spotlight on Robert **Smothers**

Robert has been on the dance scene for

two years now, and we became even better acquainted with him when he and several other local men assisted with the beginner classes last October. He wanted to make sure each lady had an opportunity to practice each newly taught step with a "seasoned" partner. His help was invaluable.

Robert, who is a life-long resident of Rockingham County, has three brothers and a sister, and a very large extended family in the area. His work career began at age twelve unloading tobacco at his family's business, Smothers Tobacco Warehouse, in Reidsville in 1966. While attending ECU Business School, he started growing tobacco, without prior experience, "on a dare," and continued farming for thirty years. After graduating from ECU in 1978, he joined the family business, operating the tobacco auction house, eventually buying interest in the business that the family operated until 2006. As the industry changed, his family left the tobacco business, and Robert worked the last ten years as Assistant Manager of the Piedmont Triad Farmers Market. He has enjoyed being retired since December, 2017.


