The Southeastern DanceSport Championships, a Regional Qualifying Event for USA Dance, was held in Birmingham, AL late January. There were over 400 competitors from across the USA, ranging in age from 9 years to 65+ years. The Carolina Heartland Chapter had three couples compete in different age and skill level categories. And we are happy to report that all of our competitors did well.

Billy Dillon and Allison Bailey won Gold Medals (first place) in Latin in both Senior I Novice and Pre-Champion skill levels.

Mark Lichtenberger and Cynthia Romine danced in both Latin and Standard dance styles. They won a first place in Senior 3 Gold Latin and second and third places in Gold and Novice Latin, as well as a first place in Senior 3 Gold Standard and a second place in Senior 2 Gold Standard.
