Chapter Election Time Again?

Although we just held our biennial election last December, the rules have changed! USA Dance, Inc. chapter election policy has changed this year, to ensure that members of the Board of Directors will have staggered terms. This is to promote continuity between boards, since there will always be some hold-overs on the board. Board member terms of office will still be 2 years, but under the new rules we will need to elect 4 board members in 2018 (for 2019-2020 terms) and 5 members in 2019 (for 2020-2021 terms).

Henceforth there will be an election every Fall and probably will be some new board members and officers every year. There are no term limits so people can serve as many 2-year terms as they want but need to stand for election every 2 years.

The election process has already started. A small nominating and election committee will be soliciting candidates for election; this process ends by early October. The actual chapter election needs to occur by November 15th and the results announced and new officers selected by December 1st.
