Hosting Parties

- 1) Follow food and other guidelines from Vice President/Party Director Betsy
- 2) Record usage of any unopened packages or jars on inventory sheet located in the pantry on the wall.
- 3) Follow directions on back of attendance sheet, complete form.

Private Lessons

- 1) Instructor posts his/her name on calendar located in DJ corner.
- 2) Students sign in on sheet at front desk
- 3) By 10th of following month, instructor should leave a check or cash along with detail of payment, including dates, in the box provided (not party cash box) or give it to Assistant Treasurer Toni.

Floor Use Rental

- 1) Schedule on calendar if possible or coordinate with Toni for long-term use
- 2) Sign in on sheet at front desk
- 3) Put check to BDC or cash with envelope provided in separate box (not party cash box) or give it to Asst Treas. Toni.
- 4) Member fee is \$10 per hour.

1) Instructor enter planned lessons three months ahead on the form provided (on the bulletin board.)

NEW! Night Club Two-Step

David will be teaching Night Club Two-Step group classes in January. This beautiful and graceful dance is similar to Bolero

The "Two Step" was developed in 1965 by a 15 year old teen from

Whitaker, Illinois named Buddy Schwimmer. Buddy was doing a line dance called "Surfer Stomp". It was based on two steps and a stomp. This worked well with fast music, but the footwork was too slow for medium and slow tempo songs. The timing was changed and it went from a line dance to a partnership dance. This then became the dance called "Two Step". Eventually in 1978, Buddy opened a dance studio in Costa Mesa, California and started teaching "Night Club Two Step".

The "Two Step", like all dances has gone through changes over time. It has evolved into two different feeling dances. The original footwork was "Rock, In Place, Side" (Quick, Quick, Slow), which exists in the dance called "Night Club Two Step".

The Country Western dancers have adopted it and have included it in their competitions. However, it has been "ballroomized" into a dance called "Ballroom Two Step". Ballroom Two Step's basic foot work is "Side, Cross Behind, In Place (Slow, Quick, Quick). These two variations have very different feelings.

The "Ballroom Two Step" is very gliding, continuous, strong and powerful with a big sweeping feeling. It is precise and quite technical. "Night Club Two Step" feels more like a choppy Cha Cha and is quite compact. It has a more casual relaxed feeling.

The "Ballroom Two Step" and "Night club Two Step" are not fad dances. They are here to stay. The "Two Step" is popular in California and all along the west coast. It's popularity is slowly moving east. It is taught at BYU (Brigham-Young University) and is starting to be taught in Europe. It is just a matter of time before it is danced everywhere in the United States.

- 4. DJ ButteredBiscuit: Your very own Stephen Duane who specializes in collecting authentic Jazz music and sharing his love for the Golden Age of Swing.

The cost is \$5 for members and \$10 for non-members. What a great way to end the week!!





























