

CENTER STAGE

Serving as a DanceSport Observer at Nationa

I was recently invited to serve as a DanceSport Observer at the ann Dance National Championships held in Baltimore, Maryland, from Ma 29, 2015. While I, as chapter president, had the good fortune, w chapter was recognized as the 2011 National Chapter of the Yea invited to attend this annual event, I made it clear that I had no ex serving as a DanceSport Observer. Nonetheless, I was encouraged organizers to serve in this capacity. Knowing that it would be an in experience that would benefit USA Dance and that would broa perspective, both as an amateur dancer and as an amateur comp agreed.

The position of DanceSport Observer is a critical one for USA

DanceSport, as it ensures the integrity of, not only costume rules overall operations of the national qualifying events and the championships.

The work of the lead DanceSport Observer actually begins in advance competition verifying the qualifications of the adjudicating panel and himself/herself available to the event organizer for any questions t come up prior to the event.

Upon arrival at the competition site, the DanceSport Observer has a c of items to verify in order to ensure rules and guidelines are followed verifies that all judges are present and under contract, that all regist citizens of the United States and current USA Dance members, obse registration process to identify and to assist in correcting problem ensures that proper dressing room facilities are available, determin ballroom and practice floors meet USA Dance standards/availab monitors costuming to ensure no rule infractions.

Once the competition begins, the DanceSport Observer is respon monitoring the management of the event: music tempo and length, is create delay problems, proper number of qualified judges and invigi the floor for events, proper number of couples on the floor for each 1 responsible for no shows) and other miscellaneous duties that affect competition. Following the competition, the lead DanceSport Obs responsible for filing a very thorough report that becomes an document of the DanceSport Council. The report is also shared with t organizer to be used as a tool for improvement.

The biggest challenge the DanceSport Observer faces at a competitior in more than one place at one time. For this reason, larger com require more than one Observer. The DanceSport Observers set volunteer capacity, giving up their weekends to assist USA Dance to mission regarding DanceSport.

For me, there were two main duties: outside the ballroom signing costume checks for those competitors who required them and in ballroom observing the competitors to assure that they were in conwith the costume rules.

Outside the ballroom, clothing/costumes was/were presented to us on or held up for us to view. We also checked shoes and jewelry t compliance. For example, the rules did not allow the female compe certain categories to wear anything sparkly on their dresses or the Without being signed off on the required costume check, a competit not attain credentials to enter the ballroom.

Inside the ballroom, we were interested and attentive observers, like observers. However, we had to actively watch all dancers, not relatives, friends or favorites. Not surprisingly, it was usually the competitors, not the male competitors, who required counseling. \Box

done in private with the competitor or the competitor's parent o depending on age, at the end of the heat. My experience as an ele and middle school principal served me well when it was necessary f speak to a competitor or her parent. For example, one junior competi danced in the Latin category, was wearing an appropriate costu included a conservative bottom as part of her costume. However, the 1 danced, the more it rode up exposing her buttocks, which is a violatic rules. After her heat, she was called by number to the officials' table. began my comments in this way, "You look gorgeous and your da amazing... however..." Then, I would address the infraction consequence that could be imposed by the chair of the event (not m infraction was not corrected prior to the next time on the dan Corrections could include temporary fixes such as glue or tape or sa or change of costume. Some infractions, if not corrected, con to automatic disqualification; others could lead to a one-place pen example, the chair of the event had the authority to impose a four finish on a third place finish depending on the infraction.

While these conversations are never easy, in most cases, the competithat I was trying to help her. In some cases, the competitor sought me to thank me for my caution. In some cases, the competitor sought m on the correction or the change of costume prior to dancing again t compliance.

It is always interesting how things turn out. The one young adult co with whom I spent the most time critiquing her original costume, he choice which also included an infraction, and then a third very sexy, elegant Latin costume that would clearly dance well and appropriatel floor, took a first place in their final heat. I left my seat to place myst to them quickly when they left the awards ceremony in order to con them, to give them each a huge hug, and to compliment them for re calm, positive, and respectful during the "ordeal." Their maturity, inclucalm demeanor of the male competitive partner, clearly helped them past the costume issues and to dance their best. I was so proud of then
