He was born into a dairy farm family in 1962 where he raised calves, shoveled manure, hoed tobacco and generally worked his butt off in rain, sleet, snow...well, you get the picture. His parents are strict Southern Baptist. Apparently that means no dancing. He learned this after having raised the most funds for his senior prom only to be informed that he couldn't go. After the dance was well underway he was allowed to slip away to the school where he pulled himself up to a window. Seeing all he was missing, his heart broke. Years later, his first marriage didn't work out so well. His wife enjoyed Designing Women and other programming that was demeaning to men. So when, many years after his divorce, he stum-bled into Paula East's ballroom class on Waltz he was delighted to find that ladies are very happy to have a man around, and esteem them greatly. To his surprise he found that the men are not expected to be great dancers, and are graciously allowed mistakes. The only thing the ladies asked was for the man to be a gentleman and show up. Instructors Paula East, Dianne Kent, and Jim Riley taught David Leathers in the early years how to behave as a gentleman. And the welcome he felt from the ladies kept him coming back. "There's a bit of healing every time I extend my hand, and a lady accepts" David is 'oft known to say. And his parents? He asked his mother about their beliefs one day. She traced it back to a time when his dad took her to a club in Louisville KY where ladies got on the tables and took off their clothes. After showing his parents photos and video of our dances, David's parents are content, and even happy for the quality people of USA Dance and the friendships formed through ballroom dance. We call it social dance now, but David has reason to be nostalgic: It was through Paula East's First Friday ballroom dance at the Macon Sports Hall of Fame that he fell in love with and then married the most gracious Debra
