We had a very busy year. Below is a brief **summary** of what the Heartland Chapter was able to accomplish in **2016**.

- Conducted 3 Ballroom sessions for IPS kids through KDO program
- Organized **14 Community Exhibitions**, including exhibitions at the Arts Garden, Carmel Senior Living, Northridge Gracious Retirement Living, Elderberries, Health and Fitness Expo at the Indiana State Fairgrounds, Girls Inc, Children's Bureau and the IN State Fair
- Celebrated Heartland's 5<sup>th</sup> year Homecoming at the Indiana Roof
- Heartland's Ballroom Technique Workshop was sold out for 3 years in a row
- Average Attendance at our monthly dances increased by 27%
- Took an active part in **Special Olympics** training, competition and 21<sup>st</sup> Annual Ballroom Bash Fundraiser
- Received a grant from "Lilly Hands & Hearts". 1st grant ever to be awarded to Heartland
- Heartland was one of the 19 local art organizations that participated in 2016 annual **Spotlight Indy Fundraiser**. The Fundraiser raised over \$210K for the Indiana AIDS Fund
- Organized New Year's Eve Fundraiser, with proceeds earmarked for Chapter's ballroom lessons for kids.

# Meet Alexis McCall - Heartland's new Special Project Coordinator



What is your passion? Where do you find your joy? I found myself asking those very questions a few years ago. I suppose we all find ourselves asking those very poignant questions at some point. I was spending my days working as a crisis therapist at a downtown hospital. That summer morning I was working with a depressed client and was talking to her about improving her life. I asked her the above questions. I got home that evening and looked in the mirror. I saw a woman without a passion and one that somewhere along the line had lost her joy.

I stood there reflecting on my life. I have an exciting job full of interesting stories and one that is quite action packed. I had raised two amazing boys who were off to college but I stood there lonely and bored.

I ponder what I could do to improve my situation. I had always wanted to learn to dance. I am sure flipping through the channels and seeing Dancing with the Stars

added to that. I had wanted to dance for years but with a family and career I just never found the time. The next morning I got online and started my journey towards dancing. I found a beginner dance class that worked with my schedule. I decided right then, come Hell or high water, I was going to learn to dance. That next week I

pulled in the parking lot of the dance studio. I was nervously walking in and I actually said to myself "For God's sake I am a crisis worker at the county hospital. I deal with psychotic, suicidal and homicidal people daily. I can handle this."

I stepped into my first group dance class. It was a beginning Rumba class being taught by Ben Davis and Connie Hatherill. They were two great teachers for a newbie like me. They made the class fun and simple. A few classes down the road I actually got the basic Rumba box step and started feeling like I had this dancing thing down. Boy was I wrong. I didn't know there was more to



dancing besides the basic footwork. Oh no, there is timing, connection, holds, arm styling and the list goes on and on. Believe it or not I don't really think I knew there was music playing. I sure didn't know there was such a thing as counting music.

After a few private lessons with the amazing Scott Shook I actually made my way to the real dance floor. One on the first people to ask me to dance was Roger Greenawalt. I am sure you all know the experience level he has, not exactly in my league. I thought I was going to die but he was so nice. I stepped on his feet and banged his knees several times. I apologized and what he said was so sweet and true. He said "unfortunately, no one here was born knowing how to dance. We all started out just like you." Everyone in the dance community was so friendly and accepting of this new dancer.

I have been taking private lessons with John Berry for about a year and a half now. He is like a big brother. He is not afraid to say something if it is wrong but is also your biggest supporter. I don't have enough space to tell you how great I think he is. Maybe this will paint a picture of my work with John Berry. I took that first Rumba group lesson May 2014. I did my first big Bolero show at the Indiana Roof in August 2015. If you did the math that is 14 months and that demonstrates the teaching ability of that man.



I currently have so much fun doing activities with USA Dance. I dance with the Special Olympians team that is instructed by Monica Lung. I compete in USA Dance amateur competitions with my amateur partner Ben Davis (remember Ben that first Rumba teacher). In addition to performing show dances we also participate in many community exhibitions for USA Dance. Ben and I have been dancing together for two and a half years now. He took on "dance baby" as a partner and I am so grateful. There is no way I would be where I am today without those countless hours of practice with him. I know how much work it was for him and it could not have been much fun in the beginning. I guess anyone in the dance community knows how hard it is to get a good dance partner but there is hope. If you can't find a partner you can always grab the first newbie you see, grab some steel-toed shoes and build your own.

I have discovered that dancing is like a never ended road trip. I have learned the further you get down the road the more you have to go. I have learned I will never be satisfied with the destination because there is always more to accomplish. One thing for sure is that I definitely found the answer to my questions. I found that dancing is my passion and the dancers that I am lucky enough to have in my life are my 2nd family.


