THE WEARING OF THE GREEN

As the Irish saying goes, "There are two kinds of people in the world, the Irish and those who wish they were". March 17 most of us will be wearing green and celebrating St. Patrick's Day. Did you ever wonder why we wear green on St. Patty's Day? Originally it was the color blue that was associated with Ireland. However, as a political statement for independence from British rule, the color green became a symbol of sympathy for the cause. People who wore green were often killed. In Ireland, some still follow the tradition where Catholics wear green and Protestants wear orange. These two colors are represented on the Irish flag along with the white on the flag symbolizing peace between the two. Ireland is also called the Emerald Isle so named for its lush green landscape. The shamrock was the clover that St. Patrick used in his teachings about Catholicism.

Forget to wear green on St. Patrick's Day? Don't be surprised if you get pinched! A tradition started in America in the early 1700's, St. Patrick revelers thought wearing green made them invisible to leprechauns who would pinch anyone they could see. People began pinching those who didn't wear green as a reminder that leprechauns would sneak up and pinch those not wearing green.

IRISH DANCING

Irish dance is based on traditional Irish folk dances and includes the reel, the jig, the hornpipe and the double jig. At one time Irish traditions including dance were outlawed and until the 1700's had to continue in secret. Around 1750 less strict attitudes allowed Irish dance to flourish. During the 18th century, the dancing master appeared in Ireland. He was a wandering dancing teacher who travelled from village to village in a district, teaching dance to peasants. Dancing masters were flamboyant characters who wore bright clothes and carried staffs. Group dances were developed by the masters to hold the interest of the less gifted pupils and give them the chance to enjoy dancing. The standard of these dances were very high. Solo dancers were held in high esteem and often doors were taken off hinges and laid on the ground for the soloists to dance on.

Today, the Irish dance form most widely recognized is step dancing (made popular by Riverdance) which can be divided into two categories of social- and performance-based dances. Arm movements are kept either completely still or move very little to highlight a dancer's self-control and discipline. At one time the parish priests thought it to be less provocative.

The costume of an Irish step dancer is particularly important, especially when it comes to the dancer's footwear. A dancer can either wear a hard and heavy shoe or a softer, lighter shoe, depending on the type of dance. The type of shoe a dancer wears also indicates a certain difficulty level as this form of the dance requires the stomping of feet and keeping time to often intricate or irregular music.

Irish dance was made popular in recent times through Michael Flatley's "Lord of the Dance" performances. Micheal Flatley was the first American to win the World Championship in Irish Dance.

Angelique Brown is a teacher who began dancing at age 10, and since then has trained with three world-class instructors, John Berry, Rauno Ilo, and Glenn Weiss. She has competed all over the U.S. and Canada, and has won numerous national titles at U.S.D.C. and Ohio Star Ball, to name a few. Dance became a real passion, and teaching is something she's always been interested in. Teaching in a group setting is particularly fun, as Angelique loves being able to meet new people, introduce beginners to ballroom dance, or help seasoned dancers develop their skill!
