Gumbo Selected to Launch New Competitive Events

Recently the Governing Council of USA Dance voted to replace Mixed Proficiency competition events with Teacher Student events, for the first time allowing Professional DanceSport Athletes to participate in USA Dance competitions. The Gumbo

DanceSport Championships was selected as the inaugural site for such events and the planning committee is already at work incorporating these events into the three day schedule.

What are Teacher Stu-

dent events? They are events danced in competition where only the DanceSport Athlete is judged. A teacher can be a professional instructor (teacher) or he/she can be another DanceSport Athlete who is not judged in the events.

Competition Update cont'd

In Teacher Student events the teacher is allowed to dance with his/her student regardless of the sex and age of the student. A couple dancing in Teacher Student events is not allowed to dance in the other Gumbo national qualifying events (NQE) or National Championship events. This means that non-judged DanceSport Athlete John cannot dance Teacher Student with DanceSport Athlete Sue and also dance with her in other events held at the Gumbo. They are restricted to the Teacher Student events. However, if John has another partner, he can dance with her in the other events, as can Sue. Professional DanceSport Athletes are not allowed to dance in the other events. The exciting part of Teacher Student events is that it opens the door for professional instructors to take their students to a high quality dance competition that is reasonably priced.

The national organization has not worked out all of the rules regarding Teacher Student competition, so this year the Gumbo will offer many of the same events to Teacher Student as the NQE. In the future the Gumbo will adopt guidelines established by USA Dance. This is an important step forward for the future of USA Dance and we are pleased to be asked to kick it off.

Again this year the Gumbo will host the Senior IV USA Dance National Championships. Last year we drew a crowd of World Class Senior IV competitors and we anticipate much the same again this June.

Another change to the offerings this year is the introduction of Master of Syllabus events in all four dance styles. These are open age group events and the couples are allowed to costume regardless of their age. Dancers in

these events are allowed to dance syllabus steps only and they will be invigilated.

For the first time the Gumbo will offer World DanceSport Federation events; Senior III & IV Standard. These events are championship open events and require all WDSF certified judges, one being from another country. We are looking forward to opening our weekend to the WDSF dancers.

The price structure for competitors has also changed in that competitors will pay a registration fee plus a fee for each entry. This is an advantage for couples who compete in only one or two events, so we are hoping the change will be received favorably.

Mark your calendar now and plan to attend the best USA Dance NQE June 26-28, 2015, at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. For

Martin felt that on Veterans Day it was only proper to honor wounded warriors. "The government doesn't do enough for our vets, especially the wounded warriors, and we can do something for them," Martin said. The \$7,000 used for the cash gifts was raised by Post 377 and USA Dance Gumbo Chapter 5031 during a recent National Ballroom Dancing Week fundraiser for the wounded warriors. At the event, Mike Martin thanked USA Dance for holding the fundraiser to honor wounded veterans.

Two Talented Local Teens Looking for Sponsors

Osman Torres is 18 and a senior at Jesuit High School, New Orleans. He is an honor student and starting defensive lineman for Jesuit's 2014 State Championship Football team. He will be attending LSU in the fall to study engineering and will continue competing in ballroom and Latin DanceSport.

Osman was introduced to ballroom dance in the 5th grade Jefferson Parish School dance program. He has been dancing 7 years. He was originally taught by Stephan Howard at Starlight Ballroom Studio in Metairie.

Taylor Schoen is 16 and a sophomore at Runnels High School in Baton Rouge. She is also an honor student with multiple academic awards. As a preschooler, Taylor began other forms of dance but switched her primary focus to ballroom at age 13 with Ric Seelig at his studio in Baton Rouge. She has been training in ballroom and rhythm for 3 years.

Osman and Taylor's short term goal is to compete at USA National Championships, March 27-29, 2015 and win in all qualified areas: Silver Smooth, Silver Rhythm, Bronze Latin. The couple will be competing in the Adult Age group.

The couple is now coaching with Kathryn Schaffer and Chris Skates in competition technique and choreography in both Smooth & Rhythm dances. Their Latin coach is Ashley Savina Goldman from Boston who trained with Shirley Ballas in Los Angeles before enrolling in LSU this academic year.

Their long term dance goals and training are to advance in Open levels and eventually win Championship level Latin and Standard. They also desire to compete internationally.

Following their participation in the 2015 USA DanceSport National Championships, Osman will undergo surgery on his shoulder and then rehabilitation. During this period they plan to focus on Latin choreography and technique, focusing primarily on footwork until his shoulders are ready for dancing. They hope to be able to compete again starting in November of 2015.
