The 1996 Minnesota Star of the North Games were hosted by Moorhead June 21-30. This year's competition was also open to residents of Cass County, North Dakota because of its proximity across the river. The Ballroom Dance competition was held at the Fargo Eagles Club on June 29 and hosted by the **Northern Lights Chapter of USABDA**. This year had 29 participants, up from last year in Roseville but still less than we would like to see. Still, both competitors and spectators had a very enjoyable afternoon. Almost all the heats were hotly contested, as reflected by the closeness of the judges' marks. A particular highlight was the junior events, with all seven contestants coming from the Northern Lights Chapter junior development program.

In addition to the contested events, spectators were treated to a Country Western three-step exhibition by **Tom and Phyllis Cassatt** and the **Northern Lights Chapter Formation Team** performed a tango and a waltz. We were also privileged to watch U.S. Amateur Rhythm champions, **Nels Petersen & Theresa Kimler**, dance uncontested in the the advanced rhythm catagory.

Special thanks to our judges, **Tracy Heinze** from the Dancers Studio and **Paul & Sandra Botes** of American Classic Ballroom. In addition to judging, they also generously donated door prizes of free lessons. **Don Miller** was the organizer of the competition, **Joan Miller** and **Bonnie Ames** were the emcees, and music was supplied by **Lute Simley**.

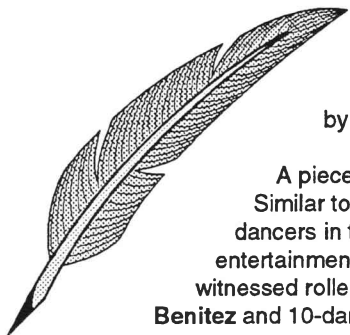

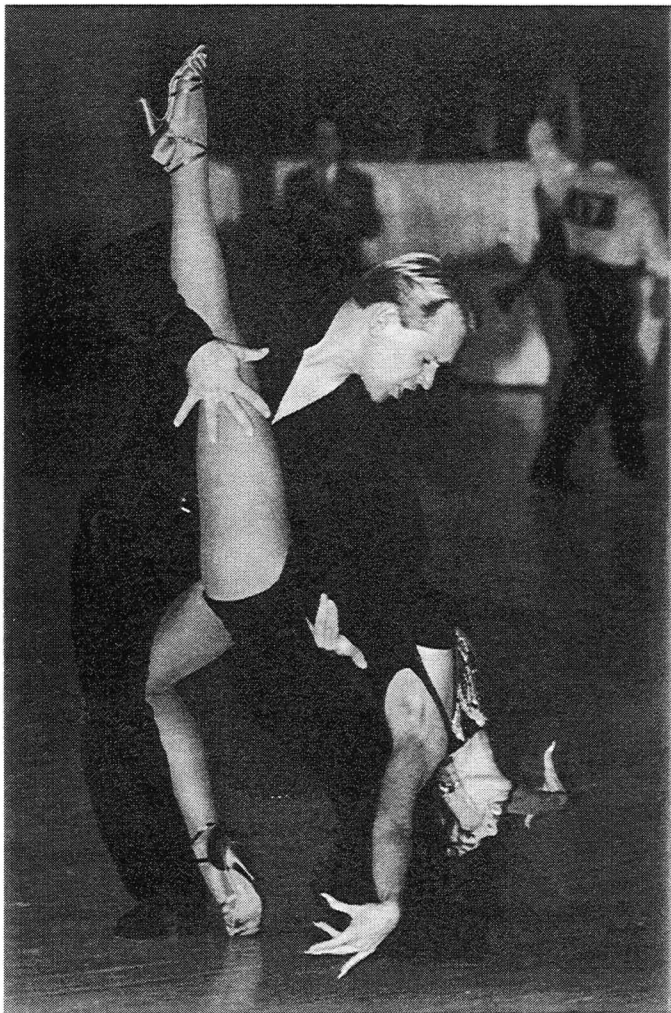
1996 Feather Awards Top Dancers in the Nation Announced Beverly Hills, CA

Set in the Beverly Hilton Hotel Ballroom with a multi-leveled stage and tiered seating, we witnessed roller skating cabaret, flamenco dancing, and presentations by latin couple **Peta Siddal & Marylynn Benitez** and 10-dance couple **Pierre Allaire & Mireille Veillux**.

Presentation of the awards included celebrities **Ann Margaret, Connie Stevens, Frankie Avalon, and Bobby Burgess**.

Awards were presented in the Ballroom, Swing, and Country Western dance styles. Due to an early flight, Nels and I attended only the Ballroom portion of the program. The results were as follows: most outstanding dance couple in the USA was **Victor Veyrasset & Heather Smith** and outside the USA was **Pierre Allaire & Mireille Veillux, Bob Powers & Julia Gorchakova** and **Nels Petersen & Theresa Kimler** were voted the best professional and amateur rhythm couples, **David Hamilton & Teresa Shiry** and **Victor & Jennifer Fung** were voted the best professional and amateur smooth couples, most popular teachers were selected as **John & Diana Berry**, and the most outstanding choreographer was voted **Chris Morris**. Amateur pro/am dancers **Martin Chiang & Melody Cochran** were also recognized. A special thank you to all who voted for us. It was an exciting evening and it is a pleasure to bring the award to Minnesota.

You can't come to many dances and not be aware of him. At six-foot-something, for the most part Owen towers above the women. But that never inhibits him from a dance with even the most petite of partners. And Owen works the floor quite thoroughly, trying at least once during an event to dance with every woman present.

Owen Gamon lives in Rochester and is a member of both **USABDA-MN** and the **Southern Minnesota Chapter**. He logs hundreds of miles monthly driving to and fro, for lessons and every dance he can attend. On top of that when he travels for his job, he E-mails National for information on whatever city he's headed to, and then goes dancing wherever there's a dance available. Just last month USABDA-Houston enjoyed a little *Minnesota Nice* as he attended their June dance. *"I really love social dancing and do it every chance I get. I've been to a lot of studio parties around the Twin Cities and I certainly appreciate all of the women who've put up with me. It's hard when you're starting out, and hopefully I've come a long way!"*

Owen's dance career is only three years old. He started lessons in Rochester and has continued them here in the Twin Cities. He's had four different instructors; **Sandra Botes, Julie Jacobson, Deanne Michael** and **Andrea Mirenda**. To date he's competed Pro-Am at Twin Cities Open, Minnesota Open and Northern Lights, as well as in Milwaukee and Las Vegas. He also won a bunch of golds (with **Kim Wettleson**) at the Star of the North Games in Rochester in 1994. And he's done about 50 demos in Rochester! The favored dance is unquestionably East Coast Swing, although he enjoys all of the American Rhythm and Smooth dances.

As to a partner, he's not really had a specific one, just whoever wants to dance at a particular event. He says that there are a lot of people in Rochester who like to dance and the Southern Chapter sees from 60-90 at most of their dances.

Even vacations aren't exempt from dancing; he's taken two dancing cruises and will be on another this winter. (See the July *Dancin' Times* for details)

When not taking a lesson, at a dance or traveling to either, Owen is a Patent Attorney for IBM-- he helps inventors and would-be-inventors patent their various creations. He's also a pianist, having started about a dozen years ago. He's even appeared at recitals! Just picture it... a bunch of little kids with their cute little outfits and adoring parents... and Owen. So he cracks a few jokes to set the mood and plays on. He's also involved in Toastmasters, giving a speech weekly.

We're very fortunate to have Owen as part of our USABDA chapter. He's a great example of what a gentleman dancer should be!

Rebels First Dance, A Great Success

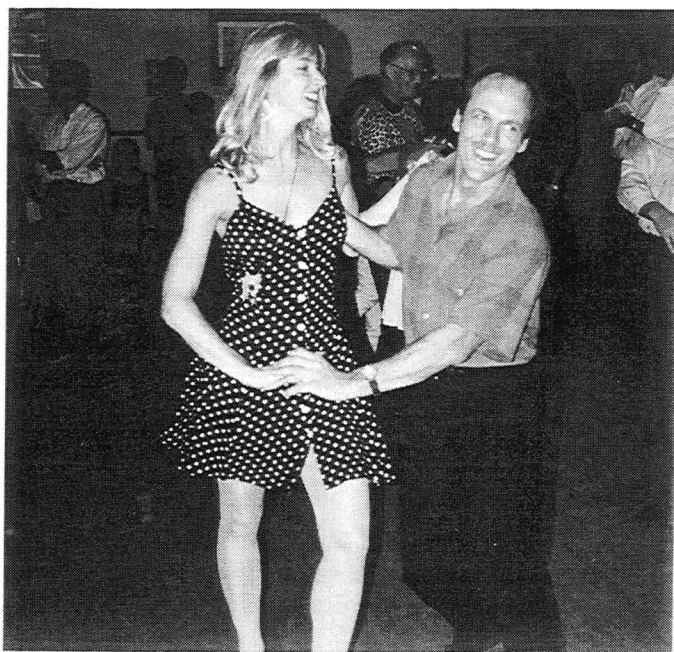

Minnesota is the home of the third Rebels Swing Dance Club in the U.S. The original club was founded by Kenny Wetzel in southern California in the late 1970s, and the second was formed in Chicago during the past year. Kenny Wetzel has been honored by the national swing dance community with many prestigious awards. When he began the Rebels, there was at least one well-established swing club in the area, but interest in its dance events had been declining. Kenny wanted to revitalize interest in swing by providing a place where people could have fun dancing. He told people: "If you want to be a Really Enthusiastic Beautiful Enjoyable Lively Swing dancer, come be a part of the R.E.B.E.L.S."

The two new Rebels clubs have formed in the same spirit. We are honored that Kenny has given his blessing to use the name and to continue the Rebels tradition. The mission of our club is: a) to provide a friendly, energetic, and supportive environment where members and guests can share a love for swing dancing and pursue individual dancing goals, and b) to promote swing dancing as a social activity in the community. Guests and new members are always welcome, regardless of ability. We offer lessons before each of our dances that are included in the price of admission.

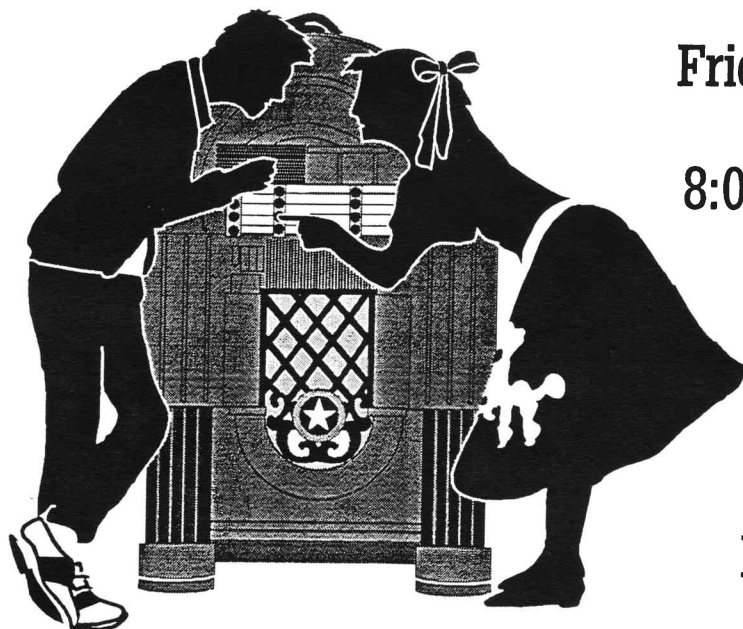

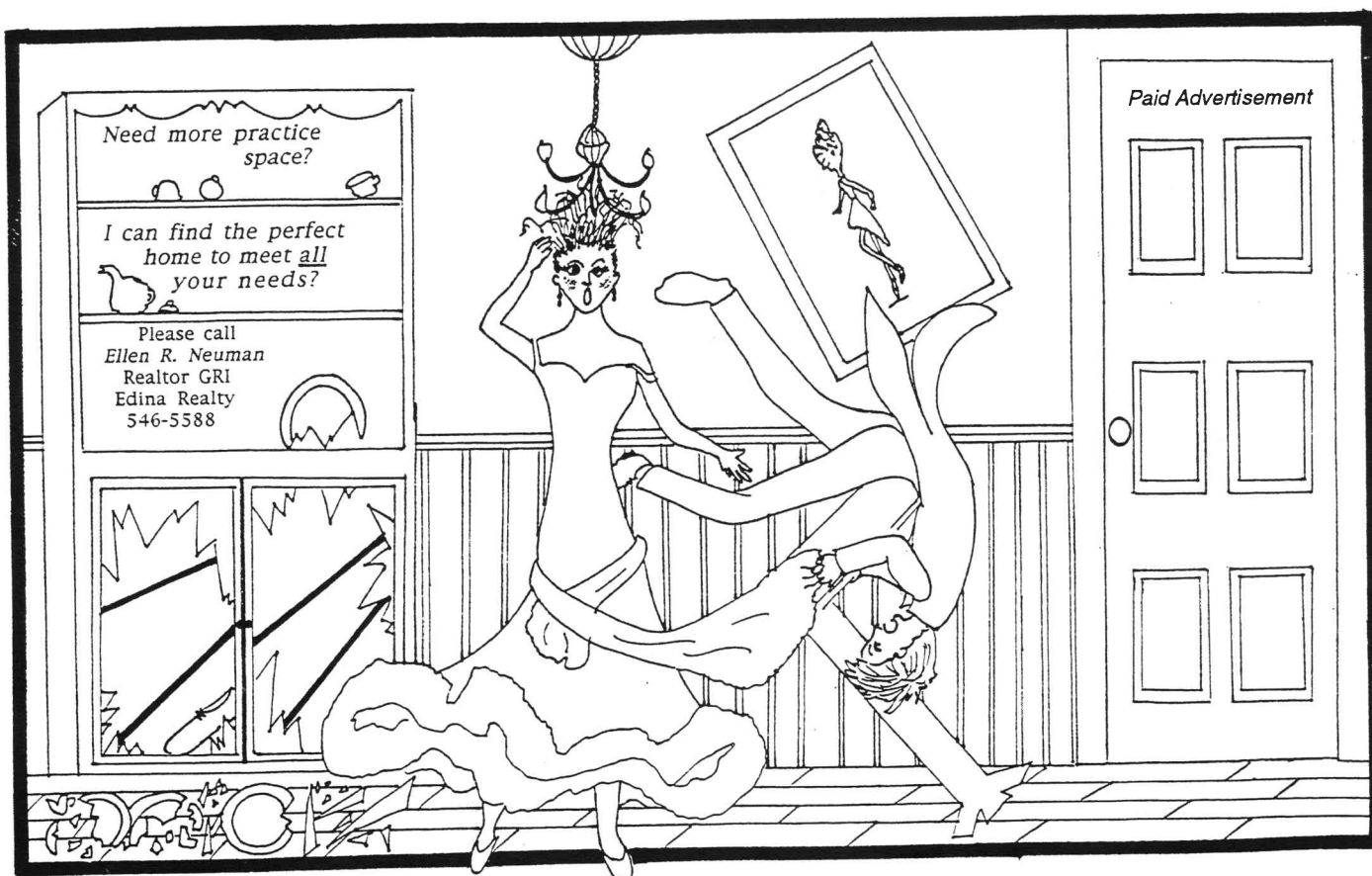
