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

## The President's Corner Attracted into Dance

t Twin Cities Open on Saturday night as I watched both the dancers and the other spectator's faces, they clearly reflected enjoyment. The joy of dance is what many of us have found in dance sport. Some spectators love to watch dance but don't care to dance themselves while other spectators would rather be dancing; at least socially. It reminds me of how I felt when I watched my first dance demo, dance competition and experienced my first monthly dances; I wanted to be dancing like the dancers I was watching.

Like anything else in life, when you really want something bad enough, you do whatever it takes to start going after your dream. When I knew I wanted to dance like the dancers I met, I started talking with them about what I needed to do in order to learn how to dance like them. Finding out the cost of dance shoes and dance lessons was a little shocking to me. Little by little, I found a way to work in dance lessons and dance shoes into my budget. It has been worth every penny and every hour I've spent learning how to dance, attend dances, dance performances and special dance events.

Today, many people are becoming attracted into dance through the dance TV shows. Yet what we see on TV seems far from the reality of our lives. That's why the dance demo's, competitions and performances in our community are helpful to attract others into dance. When we see others in our communities dancing at a level of dance quality and expressiveness, we become attracted from within to reach for more.

Dance has an incredible affect on our basic nature. I'm thinking about a movie called "Take the Lead" in which a dance teacher decided to help street teens who were in trouble at school. As part of their discipline, he taught them to dance. This is an extreme example of how dance can bring out the best creativity and personal qualities in us. So when we go to a dance lesson, social dance or any other dance activity, there is a part of us that we set free.

It feels good to be in the company of other dancers who share in our love of dance. The music that moves us in dance and the niceties that others extend to each other is very attractive. Dance teaches us how to hold other people around us in high regard. Who wouldn't be attracted to that kind of treatment? The partnership piece of dance training shows us that although men and woman are equal, the dance only really works when one person leads and the other follows. The man leads

the lady to a starting place on the dance floor, determines their direction, watches for traffic on the floor and together they move and float along the dance floor to the music. At the end of the dance "thank you for the dance" is often heard.

We invite you to join with us to attract those

who want to be dancers and encourage them as we have been encouraged. Stayed tuned to the newsletter for upcoming opportunities to demonstrate dance and be part of dance performances. Happy Dancing!

#### Dance into Your Best Life® – Finding Center

By Julie Delene

#### **Successful Pivots**

Pivots are one of my favorite moves to dance and to watch. And recently some of us at On Your Toes were discussing how to do it well. As in most steps, we look to find the center. This step in particular requires a joined center stemming from the knees. In fact the best way to execute this step is to feel the knees touch and align, creating a new temporary center, to rotate around.

As we discussed this, my mind immediately turned toward the metaphor in life.

#### **Finding a Common Center**

When we join with others in business partnerships, friendships, life partnerships, etc., we do so because of similar interests and values. These interests and values become our common center. How powerful it is to be conscious of these shared values and to clearly articulate them.

As a team facilitator, this is an ongoing discussion within business organizations. It helps to create synergy, a vortex of energy that moves the team in the same direction....similar to pivots.

With this in mind, we can apply to all our partnerships. How? Explore your values and interests and look for ways you desire to join with others. Then play with this pivot, this synergy of movement for as long as you share a common center.

#### **Changing Centers**

But what happens when your common interests shift and change?? Perhaps there is new growth, new learnings, or life changes that shift priorities.

We see this happen often in work as people decide to move into new job opportunities. Or a relationship breaks up or a new relationship begins. Or other life changes...for me, when my daughter and son-in-law began having babies, it changed my priorities, and brought me back to the Cities.

How do we maneuver then? ...when our common center shifts? Let's use dance again as a metaphor. After a pivot is complete, we move back into our own space and realign from this new perspective.

#### **Coming Home**

It is our own center that is the juice for creating common centers. Therefore, it is key to be cognizant of our home base, our heart center (notice our heart is the center of our body's functions). When we reaffirm our core values, interests and heart's desires, we can then again choose when and with whom to join with in creating a pivot together in life. Remember the dance is within you - the dance begins with you.

## ASK DR. DANCE

Donna Edelstein is a popular coach, judge and organizer of the Snow Ball DanceSport Competition. Paul Botes is owner of American Classic Ballroom.



I attended Twin Cities Open and am inspired to see all the competitors but I seem to have issues with stage fright. What is your best tip for over-coming performance nerves?



#### He Said:

Stage fright is normal unless it renders you incapable of performing. Everybody is different, but I think that knowledge gives you confidence. Make sure you know your material, trust your partner and realize that at the end of the day we are not curing world hunger but simply engaging in an activity that gives us enormous satisfaction or at worst frustrates us because deep down we

know we could have done better.

You should also examine the reasons for your trepidation. Are you dressed and groomed properly? Do you know what to expect? Does the thought of doing that particular dance give you a Maalox moment? If everything checks out, rest assured that you are prepared and enjoy the competition. Try to remember that the whole process from preparing to participating in an event should be enjoyed, even the stage fright or butterflies adds to the whole experience. Good luck!

#### She Said:

Pretty much everyone experiences stage freight at one time or another. Part of competing is learning to overcome challenges and one of them can be fear. There is no magic pill – just the willingness to bear the discomfort of starting.

Start small. Perform in a studio showcase or single day competition like Minnesota Madness, The Snow Ball or the Minnesota Star Ball.

Prepare yourself by getting comfortable with your material and your partner. Know that everyone had a first time, nobody ever feels ready, and that everyone makes mistakes. That is how we all learn.



Slow your breathing down and listen to the music. Make your goal performing and entertaining the spectators. The more you get out and try dancing in front of people, the more comfortable you will become. It takes time. Give yourself a chance to enjoy it.

#### **Gentlemen Lead**

he rests her hand on my back under my shoulder as I put my hand lightly on her lower back. I close my fingers around her other hand. I lock my shoulders down over my ribs while lifting them up, stretching my elbows to define a line. We are in communication reaching from our joined hands through my arm, across my chest, into her arm, across her back, reaching our hands again. I lift my foot, guide our center forward for two slow steps, then finish the tango basic pattern. She effortlessly mirrors my movement.

Are we dancing socially? Are we competing? Neither. My partner and I are one of three couples dancing as the Cheek To Cheek smooth formation team at the TCO. We have walked on to the dance floor with the lady's arm on the gentleman's arm, taken our position on the dance floor, and are waiting for the music.

We're telling a story as we dance, of romance, attraction and rejections, then second thoughts. We gentlemen then totally reject our lady, tossing her off to someone else. As a reward, we receive our new partner. But what happens then? More affection, rejection, second thoughts and, finally, our lady embraces us.

Formation dancing is the general term for a wide variety of dancing. At the TCO, we saw excellent performances from teams both young and old, dancing the Argentine Tango, hip-hop, jive and rock, classic waltzes, and at different levels of performance. Our tango routine is a combination of bronze and silver patterns. Some teams were much more advanced. All in all, the joy that the many diverse dancers expressed during and after performing made it a very pleasant evening.

Cheek To Cheek owner Harry Benson sponsors the smooth formation team that performed at TCO. Harry told me, "that participation on a formation team can increase a dance student's progress by clarifying and sharpening goals that may be slightly fuzzy or out-of-focus." He also affirms that having a clear goal in mind often distills and concentrates effort so that more time is spent on the desired end-point.

The Cheek To Cheek smooth team is coached by Monica Mohn. She says, "When coaching a formation team, I work to the dancers' strengths, using the choreography to challenge and stretch their dancing abilities. I look at all the possible couples to match them with what they can do best. Jack, I matched you with the tallest and shortest lady. You are a tall man and learning to dance with women of all heights will improve your social dance skills. I make the routine fun to do, interesting for both the audience and the performers, as well as a way to augment the dancers' skills."

As we prepared for the TCO performance, practices were intense. Once we became familiar with the music and learned the patterns, Monica looked for ways to help the audience understand our story. Little details were fun to work out, like deciding when the gentleman reaches for the lady's shoulder and how he



reacts when she turns and rejects his hand.

In addition to regular session with our coach, the team practices at other times, especially as we approach a performance. One of the team takes notes at the rehearsals and we focus on our homework. Monica also has us dance simple basic patterns in our tango while watching ourselves in the wall mirrors at Cheek To Cheek to improve our posture and frame.

We had fun performing, feel good about how we did, and we look forward to our next opportunity to tell our story.
