

- 2. Minutes from October approved.
- 3. Organizational Matters:
 - a. Treasurers report of gains & losses read and approved.
 - b. January Board Elections: Committee is putting together list of nominees.
 - c. Guests: Peter Westlake attended meeting and is considering a board position to help USA Dance-MN in connection to U of M students. Andy Trawick attending to report on monthly dance music.








Watching Geordie and Anna

A new Twin Cities youth couple shines at "Minnesota Madness"

On October 24, my dance partner and I participated in the social dance for the hustle and waltz at the "Minnesota Madness" event held at the Shakopee Ballroom. "Madness" described the event perfectly since some of the dance contest included reversal role and hula hoop contest. My parents and I enjoyed watching the competitive dancers and the formation shows, such as the sleigh bell dancers. The dancers, however, who really caught my eye and my heart was a young boy and girl who competed in various competitive dances. Amazed at the grace and beauty of the two, I decided to search for their parents to find out more about the young dancers.

Kelly Roscoe, mother of Geordie, shared with me the following story of her son and his dance partner, Anna Gonikman. Geordie Roscoe, now eleven, started dancing at age seven at Foster's DanceSport Studio in Hopkins, Minnesota. It all started when Kelly saw the Foster's Volkswagen Beetle plastered with photos of kids ballroom dancing. Kelly signed Geordie up for lessons, and immediately saw how happy her son became when dancing, and knew that this was the sport that best fit his personality. Watching Geordie dance made Kelly and her husband George realize how much they missed dancing themselves, and soon they started taking lessons as well.

In January, 2006, Tony Karadzhov came over to the US and started coaching the Roscoe family. Tony was born and raised in the Eastern European country of Bulgaria. As a child, he trained in gymnastics for years until the age of twelve when he was introduced to ballroom dancing. Under the influence of Tony, Geordie's dance skills started to improve and the search for the perfect partner for Geordie began.

In November, 2008, Geordie and Anna met at a children's group class given at The Four Seasons Dance Studio. Anna Gonikman, now twelve, was in rhythmic gymnastics, and had recently retired from the sport due to an injury to her back. Anna's parents soon found out that Anna had the passion and desire to dance. Magic happened when Anna and Geordie made the commitment to practice together at least 8 hours a week. Anna and Geordie as partners have learned to work as a team and have become great friends. Dance has helped them gain confidence, build muscle memory, and learn the discipline to work toward the goal of improving their skill for competitive dance events.

Thank you to the parents of Anna and Geordie for introducing your son and daughter to the sport of dance. I truly believe that dance is one sport that two people can enjoy longer than any other. It is not only great for the body, but it is great for relationships. Geordie and Anna's next competitions will be at the "Chicago DanceSport Challenge Championship" the weekend of February 19, and "The Star of the North" on February 27. I encourage you to go and watch Geordie Roscoe and Anna Gonikman.



THE GIFT OF DANCE

Seems like most of the USA Dance-MN demos in which Janis and I have participated have taken place at senior living centers. We like that. The dance floors are always tiny, but the audience is always appreciative. I used to think we got lots of applause because the residents were starved for entertainment. Then I talked to the recreation coordinators at a few of these facilities and was informed that their events calendars are pretty packed. Guest performers like us are just one of many attractions available to the residents. The lists generally include shopping trips, sing-alongs, arts & crafts, nature walks, movies, birthday parties, cookie baking parties, coupon-clipping parties, and just about any excuse for a party you can name. These people make me look like a shut-in.

Of course, nature walks and sing-alongs are fun as well as therapeutic. But dance demos seem to have a special effect on the audience. Staff members have told us that the residents are still talking about these dance shows months later. And, at nearly every demo, someone has come up to us and thanked us for bringing back some very fond memories. Janis and I try to choose music we know will be familiar to people of that generation — the big hits by Frank, Dean, Vic, Tony, and Nat. But most of all, I suspect, it's the sight of people dancing that takes the audience back to their younger days.

Fifty years ago, people didn't have malls or the internet or plasma televisions for entertainment. But they had dances like the waltz, foxtrot, polka, and the jitterbug. Even more importantly: they also had dance halls and dance bands. That's where you went to make new friends, not some singles bar. Dating service? What's that? My mother met my father at a dance. Many of my friends wouldn't be alive today if their parents hadn't crossed paths at the local dance hall. And the dancing didn't stop when the family life began. Nope. My brother and I spent many Saturday evenings with a babysitter while Mom & Dad went out hoofing.

So when I see a wrinkled face smiling and the bony little fingers tapping in time with the music, I know it's not just for us. Somewhere deep in the subconscious warehouse a connection has sparked, a sleeping memory has flickered to life, and that person is suddenly, if ever so briefly, a dancer once again.



have competed for many years. My husband is just learning to dance. We have attended a few social dances, but I can't get him out on the floor. He says he's not good enough. And he doesn't enjoy watching me dance with men who are experienced dancers. Any advice?

see dancing as something special between them as a couple, and feel uncomfortable with the intimacy of other men dancing with their wife.



He Said:

That situation could be a sticky wicket. Encourage him to take private lessons himself, but don't force the issue. Once he feels more confident he'll feel better about his ability and may even become more interested in learning. Every situation is different, though, and I encourage you to communicate well with your spouse about this issue.

She Said:

This is a tougher question than it might seem at first glance. Some husbands are just happy that their wife has dancing as a hobby and they can golf or race cars, or pursue their own hobbies as they choose. Others Since you are a competitor, and your husband is comfortable with that, perhaps the answer is for you to continue competing for the dancesport aspect, and table the social dancing for now. If your husband is enjoying his lessons and wants to continue, then give him time to become competent and confident — maybe joining him on lessons. It might be a good idea to go to restaurants that have bands, or other venues where there are not a lot of experienced dancers so that your husband gets to enjoy dancing in a real world setting — not in a studio or USA Dance environment filled with professionals and dance enthusiasts. It takes a long time for many men to feel confident leading and negotiating traffic. He'll know when he's ready.

Dance into Your Best Life® – Releasing Resistance

Release Resistance in Dance

Recently I was dancing with a student who likes to power through steps, sometimes without connection to his partner. His wife often felt bulldozed and was frustrated by their dance experience. Practicing with him, I'd find myself trying to hold him back as well to help contain his forceful movement, but this only activated it more and was therefore quite ineffective.

Instead, I noticed that when I released the resistance, he would realize his bulldozing tendency and understand what he was doing to the dance partnership. Meeting force with force was not the answer....a nice nudge to remember how to deal with resistance.

Enabler?

I have heard in Aikido it teaches the art of using your opponent's aggression and refocusing back onto your opponent. Not that this is our goal, but certainly, it is better to help the other person take responsibility for their actions, rather than absorbing them.

In fact, I think we absorb and take on others energy much more often than we realize. One definition of an Enabler in Webster's dictionary is: *one who enables another to persist in self destructive behavior by helping that individual avoid the consequences of such behavior.*

By releasing my resistance to him, I no longer engaged in his over-powering movement, for in fact, we were not dancing.

Resisting Resistance in Life

I believe this is true in life as well. We often engage in a struggle or frustration that we truly don't want, but we still do. Why? Perhaps out of fear, perhaps we desire the drama, perhaps we'd rather have that distraction than be in touch with ourselves? We can find many reasons to be engaged in ideas that keep us small.

In Marianne Williamson's book, A Return To Love, she talks about *surrender* as a feminization process, a quieting of the mind...a cultivation of personal magnetism. This attractive, receptive, feminine aspect of our consciousness is the space of mental surrender. We become more concerned with what happens on the inside.

And this is powerful. Caring about ourselves by releasing our resistances is an act of love.

What in your life can you lay down and release your resistance? With the stress of Christmas right around the

corner, this could be a helpful practice. Try it out, let go of your concern, and notice what you experience. Could it be peace??

If only we, as a country, could learn this way instead of war. Rather, let us dance. (don't we all know it!)

In her new book *The Case For God* (Knopf, New York, 2009) Karen Armstrong writes, "You cannot learn to dance, paint, or cook by perusing texts or recipes. There are some things that can be learned only by constant, dedicated practice, but if you persevere, you find that you achieve something that seemed initially impossible. But somehow you learn to transcend your original capabilities. Some of these activities bring indescribable joy." One example from Armstrong is how dancers become inseparable from the dance. She says, "The satisfaction goes deeper than merely 'feeling good.' It is what the Greeks called *ekstasis*, a 'stepping outside' the norm."

Ballroom dancing for many of us involves constant, dedicated practice. That 'stepping outside' the norm happens to me when a move goes just right. My goal is to have it be that way when I dance an entire dance. Some months ago I wrote about a dance Fran and I did at home that she characterized as "The most wonderful dance we have danced together because I was being controlled by my partner. It was so wonderful." We continue to have those "wonderful" dances together, at home, at the recent Sunset Sparkle, and other social dances.

As I write this, I am a few days away from having danced three different dances in the fall Cheek To Cheek Showcase with my instructor, Monica Mohn. We are doing this because it is fun, of course, and to show our friends how far I have come as her student. It is also a good way to get ready for the next time we compete, in January in the Snowball Competition.

Can I have the satisfaction of "stepping outside" the norm in an entire lesson? Will all three showcase dances feel that good? One reason why I write this column is to explore the evolution I am experiencing as a beginning dancer. The showcase will be my fifth, and will be the second as lead/follow dances rather than choreographed.

At my first lesson in the week leading up to the showcase, we danced the swing, rumba and waltz repeatedly to the music Monica has chosen. Some of the time I had the feeling of



partnership and at other times I needed to correct my posture, footwork, timing of leads, and so on. This is the constant, dedicated practice Armstrong wrote about. The second lesson refined what we were doing, repeating the three dances as if we were in twenty consecutive heats in competition. My dancing will only get better when I don't have to think about going through neutral or pushing with certain muscles instead of others, as they become ingrained.

After weeks of drill, practice, drill, the day arrived. I am so happy to say that for almost the whole three showcase dances, I had "that" feeling. I also did when Fran and I danced during the social portion of the event. The dancing was not like a sip of Champaign, but many sips—a full glass.
