United States Theater Arts Champions (USBC- September, 1995). Theater Arts/Cabaret Champions (Ohio Star Ball November, 1995). Currently ranked 4th in the United States in American Rhythm. These are the titles they're most proud of; titles anyone would be proud of!

Robert & Jennifer have contributed an indefinable amount to the Twin Cities ballroom dance community. Students such as Nels Petersen, Jim Baker, Terri Kimler and Carol Post (to name a few) have received national titles under their instruction and coaching. They're enormously fun to watch as competitors and wonderfully entertaining as people.

In 1986 Jennifer was teaching at **Fred Astaire Dance Studio** in Bloomington. At the same time, Robert was just coming back to teaching, and asked, "Who's that cute girl?" Strategically, they were paired up for re-training, and the rest, as they say, is history. Including the addition of their daughter, **Caitlin**, in 1988. In 1989, they spent some time in Florida, but the experience was marginal. What really drove them back to Minneapolis, oddly enough, was a car accident which left severe injuries to both. Upon returning, serious dancing was put on hiatus for about a year to recuperate. Many hours of therapy and training were needed to recover what had been lost.


It's been their dream for years to have their own studio, and it has finally become reality- the **DanceSport Baliroom**. The mansion in which the studio is located is just west of the Lyndale/ Franklin intersection. The studio is on the 3rd floor with a turn-of-the-century appeal, competition-sized floor, lots of windows, painted ceiling and plenty of parking. They're hoping that it will appeal to the romantic in all of us. Eventually they hope to add/convert the second floor of the mansion as a studio designed for children's classes. They also plan, down the road, to rent the ballroom for weddings and parties.

The Fosters travel a lot, doing shows and competitions and such. That's obviously going to slow down some as they concentrate on the new studio. It will! also give them opportunity to add to their family which is a definite goal. (By the way, Caitlin is appearing in her very first competition at TCO this month. She got her new gown from Santa and will be dancing with her dad!)

More than the applause of the audience, more that the awards, more than the titles... what really drives them both is the teaching. Jennifer said, "The reason I do what I do is that my first love is teaching. (And to continue my own education.) My students help me as much as I help them. It's really quite an honor. People often look at us and think that we love all the applause and recognition, but it's deeper than that. A teacher sees the potential- what it does for a student's life. That's what makes us tick. "




