1960's Twist (We need people to just come out and shake their thing on this one — need as many USABDA members as possible to swarm the floor to simulate a Beatles revival of "Twist and Shout" or maybe do an Elvis impersonation to "Blue Suede Shoes"!)

1970's Hustle (Possible costumes: loud color; bell-bottom pants, shirts with long, pointed collars)

1980's Competition-style 4-dance:

Waltz/Tango/Foxtrot/Viennese Waltz Competition-style 5-dance:

Cha Cha/Rumba/Mambo/Bolero/Swing (couples are encouraged to do all or just individuals)

Cabaret/Theatre Arts (AM/AM or PRO/AM)

Also, we may have a final group doing the "USABDArena" (our own version of the Macarena!) or presenting our dancers of the future by having kids perform.






