

#### **USABDA PROFILE**

## FOCUS ON USABDA MEMBERS

#### -AVELYN HOOKER-

The Hopi Indians think there is little difference between praying and dancing--both are necessary for a long life. They say that to be a useful Hopi, one must have a quiet heart and participate in all the dances. However, the heart might pound after all that dancing, which leads to more about the benefits of dancing.

Have you heard someone say, "I was too tired to move but went dancing and I feel so good?" When doing exercise one enjoys, the body creates *good feeling* chemicals (endorphins), thus one does feel better. Moving our body to beautiful music, executing intricate patterns and interacting with each other--what a great way to stay in shape both mentally and physically!

I have always appreciated music, but did not always dance. In college, a guy asked me to go to a dance; when I said I couldn't dance, he said "just jump", so we went and jumped--must have been jive or jitterbug! When the smooth music played, we had to observe.

Years passed and I found myself in Minnesota, determined to dance. I went to the Prom Ballroom in St. Paul, where a group lesson was in session. I saw a man practicing alone so I offered to practice with him. He showed me a table where "singles" sat. Someone offered me a complimentary lesson at Fred Astaire--and I was hooked on dancing! Later, that man, Dessie, and I taught and directed a S.A.T. (Singles All Together) dance class. For eight years--50 Monday nights a year--I assisted with instruction of that dance group. Dessie is still teaching there. For awhile, I did the lady's part with Pearl Bailey when she taught at the Prom and BelRae Ballrooms. I have also competed and danced in showcases.

Yes, there is life besides dancing! I play tennis regularly, do gardening, read (I'm interested in health and nutrition), travel, hold offices in community organizations and enjoy my 22-month old granddaughter--not often, because she lives in San Diego.

I just volunteered to do something which sounds exciting! I will be a judge for the 1995 "Odyssey of the Mind" competition. Groups of students are given problems to solve in creative and innovative ways. Some problems allow a preparation period, others might be impromptu. There's a training seminar to prepare me for judging. This ties in with my background since I was a teacher in the public schools.

Dean says he has seen a lot of similarity with new students, particularly males, who feel uncomfortable on the dance floor until they overcome the mystery of rhythm. He teaches them to master the basics of coordination, timing and movement.

Dean is a strong advocate of teaching ballroom dance to children. He teaches in 23 school districts and community centers. He feels it's important to learn an activity you can enjoy for a lifetime and would like to see that message carried to everyone interested in dancing.

A member of USABDA since it started, Dean shares the goal of promoting dancing to the general public. Although Dean spends much of his time teaching, he manages to fit in a racquetball game almost every day.


#### WHAT IS USABDA? WHO ARE WE?

# NATIONAL USABDA ADOPTS REBATE PROGRAM FOR CHAPTERS

The Executive Committee of USABDA will be instituting a rebate program for local chapters as a "reward" for chapters who increase and maintain membership and submit timely reports.

Adoption of this program will encourage growth of chapters. To qualify for this rebate, chapters must have been certified for a least one year as of July 1st of the 12-month period on which the rebate is based. Also, the chapters must have submitted timely and adequate semi-annual financial reports to the national Treasurer and timely and adequate Annual Reports to the national Secretary. Each chapter that meets that criteria would receive \$1 for each existing paid member as of June 30th of each year, plus \$3 for each net increase in paid membership achieved during that 12 month period. For example, a chapter increases its paid membership from 150 to 200. The chapter would receive a rebate of \$200 (\$1 for each member) plus \$150 (\$3 x 50) for the net increase in paid members--for a total rebate of \$350.

As of June 30, 1994, the total paid national membership was 10,092. As of September 30, 1994, membership had increased to 10,570. National USABDA predicts that membership will continue to grow at a rate of 15 to 20% per year. Currently, that growth is being produced by new chapters rather than by established chapters. Thus, the Executive Committee proposes this program of rewarding established chapters.


