


Ohio Star Ball



Dance for Life

A new dance program is being developed which is targeting our next generation of dancers: school-age children. The program intends to create self-sufficient after-school dance clubs which will teach a variety of dances to students.

The program sponsor, Minnesota Association for Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance (MAHPERD), recognizes that children have become more sedentary than ever before. The advent of computer games, increased video and television viewing, and a lack of suitable (and safe) afterschool facilities have contributed to the inactive lifestyle of a majority of today's youth. David Schmit and Kathy Gamble, the President and Vice-President of MAHPERD's Dance Council, have strong dance backgrounds and see dance as fun, entertaining and healthy while promoting important social skills. Even the working title of the project, "Dance for Life," suggests the duality of its purpose: first, dancing is a skill that can be used throughout one's life; and second, the aerobic exercise of dancing promotes a healthier, more active lifestyle.

The pilot program will begin in February at Olson Memorial Junior High. Professional dance instructors will work with Olson's faculty to present a six week course. At the end of the course, a school dance is planned where students can enjoy the skills they've learned.

David and Kathy are hoping to make "Dance for Life" a state-wide program and are investigating the creation of a videotaped program for that purpose. If anyone has an interest in helping in any way or is interested in more information, please call David at 740-5998 or Kathy at 789-6225.



I'm pleased to say that at least from my personal perspective, that has *never* been the case. You've repeatedly expressed your appreciation for the quality of the newsletter, its timeliness, its appearance and its content. Of course, it's a two-person deal, with me as editor and Bruce Willits as the designer.

The newsletter has grown substantially during our term, mainly due to members and advertisers using it as a tool for communication. The upside of that is the obvious benefit to the readers; the downside of that is the obvious workload for those who put it together. Your next editor will need your help. If you haven't volunteered for USABDA, consider this an opportunity. People are needed to gather information, write articles, sell advertising, do the bulk mailing and more. Please think about how you can help.

The experience I've gained is valuable beyond description.
