Holiday Gala Dance!

USA Dance Minnesota has been experimenting with theme dances recently, and what better time of year to hold a theme dance than the December Christmas/ Hanukkah/Solstice season? Yes! And importantly, about 130 guests thought so, too, as they eagerly arrived at Cinema Ballroom, St. Paul, on the evening of December 16.

There is always a complimentary dance lesson just before the variety dance and this evening was no exception. Instructor Isaac skillfully guided 40-50 dancers through a Viennese Waltz lesson – not an easy dance for beginners, but very popular with more experienced dancers.

DJ Lee Whitney, President of USA Dance-Minnesota, played a wide selection of holiday tunes while the dancers whirled around a black tripod safely taped in the middle of the dance floor. An opportunity for excellent floor craft practice!

USA Dance Minnesota was conducting research at this dance. A firm called VR 360 (such as in "Virtual Reality") filmed the dancing for several hours during the event. The tripod was in the middle of the dance floor so as to make continuous recordings in all directions. The video obtained may be crafted into a ballroom dance scene to perhaps be viewed someday through virtual reality headsets. The viewer will feel as though they are on the floor with the dancers!

Mid-evening, there were holiday performances by the Sleigh Belle Dancers, and a "Grease" medley, energetically and skillfully performed by Tyler Bridges and partner Stephanie Riley. The social mixer was longer than usual, but everyone was enjoying it so much – and it takes more than three songs to give all 130 dancers a chance to meet prospective partners. A suggestion to have a Viennese Waltz mixer, rather than the usual Waltz/Foxtrot mixer, was politely declined!

The excitement and fun generated by theme dances is contagious and we hope you'll consider joining us for the next one. Everyone is welcome at USA Dance monthly dances, which are always held on the third Saturday of each month. Admission is reasonably priced at \$5 for students with a current student ID; \$10 for members; and \$15 for non-members. We hope you'll dance with us, soon!

Jeralyn Mohr and Ha Tuong Doing Dance Demos at Shopping Malls

For many years, Yvonne and Dan Viehman have been organizing, with the assistance of their children, dance exhibits at retirement homes, to entertain seniors, and at shopping malls, to celebrate the National Dance Weeks and the Holidays. For as many as five years, Jeralyn Mohr (silver and open level) and Ha Tuong (gold star 2, has danced in Yvonne and Dan's events even longer), have been participating in these demos with other amateur couples to help promote dancing. The beautiful thing about these demos is that they serve the peaceful common good of the community and promote a selfless healthy life. Jeralyn and Ha always look forward to the next demo.

What is particular about Jeralyn/ Ha's partnership is that they are not interested in competition or showcase, but enjoy the most contributing the fruit of their practices to the community, and, most importantly, dancing with each other among others. They actually perform only in Yvonne and Dan's shows! Most of the steps they use are from intermediate and open level Dvida syllabus learned from Cinema Ballroom studio. You might not recognize the steps because they are the product of an unconventional combination of American and International styles. Some adaption and alteration have to be created to link American to International. Of course, they love to dress up with competition costumes for Yvonne and Dan's events, as you can see in Facebook posts. Their favorite dances are Rhumba and, next, Bolero which you might be surprised to know that it incorporates some International Rhumba moves. After all, they dance for the artistic pleasure, and not competition standards ... Jeralyn and Ha are not sure whether their love for Rhumba and Bolero has come from the slow Latin music or the graceful romantic dance moves. They practice at Anytime Fitness in Mendota Heights!

For now, they plan to concentrate efforts mainly on the five Rhythm dances (with a touch of Interna-

tional in them, of course). In the near future, as Ha's new titanium/steel knee recovers, they will expand into the slower Smooth dances (that won't kill his knee). You might be wondering what their smooth/standard combination is going to look like ... next year will tell.

Talking about Jeralyn and Ha, one cannot forget Carol Rosier, Ha's wife. She has been a tremendous support for Ha and Jeralyn, as well as for all of his previous partners. She dances too (she used to be a silver level dancer), but not as seriously as Ha. Performing in front of others is a "no way, Jose" for her. You will see her dancing at some social dances, such as USA Dance or studio events, and competition, such as TCO, Snow Ball, or Ohio Star Ball, to support Ha and his instructor Julie Jacobson. Like a soccer mom, since they got married in 2001, she has been carrying a camera to take his pictures dancing with his partners.



If you keep up on my blogs, you know that besides loving to watch 'Dancing With the Stars' and awards shows, I am a Broadway Musical fan...I LOVE to watch

great singing and dancing!

Now that the winter doldrums

are setting in – with the cold and the darkness, especially here in the upper Midwest, we need to plan for fun adventures to keep us going, until we can become inspired by the refreshing sights, sounds and smells of the greenery of spring... Yes, spring is coming!

My daughter and I had never experienced the sights and sounds of the Christmas season in New York City, so this was the year for this fun adventure! It was cold, windy and snowy, but also VERY sparkly, with Holiday markets and lots of Christmas decorations adorning traditional trees and department store windows. It was so inspiring!

But the best part of our trip was

enjoying two Broadway musicals - both with fabulous costuming, and then the grand production of The Radio City Christmas Spectacular, featuring the Rockettes. Most likely you are reading this in late December or early January, so yes, it is too late for booking a trip for this winter season, but it IS 'spectacular'. And anyone who enjoys singing, dancing and Christmas - put this show on your list. There is nothing more fun than the Radio City Theater all decked out in its Christmas finery and watching 36 pairs of high-kicking legs! (Yes, in fabulous costumes!)

As a costume designer (with a dance costume specialty) I get visual inspiration from all types of performances. As dancers, you should also be looking for choreographic inspirations. I love getting my inspiration from Broadway Show costuming. This Christmas in the City's trip featured seeing "Hello Dolly" (with Bette Midler, a personal favorite)

and "Anastasia". The over-the-top "Dolly" costuming was a real treat for me (designed by Santo Loquasto, who received the Tony Award this season for Best Costume Design), and watching the Russian and French period costuming of Anastasia (designed by Linda Cho) came to life.

In addition to these visual costume extravaganzas, I included two exhibits at my favorite FREE (yes, there are many FREE activities in NYC) Fashion Institute of Technology Costume Museum and the Downton Abby Exhibition that just happened to be set up during our visit (not free).

What inspires you? To me, experiences outweigh 'things' and the memories enrich our existence. I will keep 'visions of costumes' dancing in my head, to tide me over until the flowers of spring are able to inspire me.

I have had a 'thing' for the Rockettes since I first saw their travel-

ing show in St. Louis, MO while I was exhibiting our Satin Stitches' dance team costumes, back in 1993! The Rockettes are an upscale version of our own incredible Minnesota high school high-kick dance teams.

Several costume designers are listed in the Christmas Spectacular program, including Gregg Barnes. Barnes designed the Broadway 'Aladdin' costumes. (Some Aladdin costumes were manufactured by Parsons-Meares Ltd. – a New York company that I had the opportunity to tour and to view original Aladdin sketches and some prototypes, several years ago.) My design hero, Bob Mackie has also designed Rock-

ette costumes in the past.

The famed movie director, Vincente Minnelli designed the iconic toy soldier costumes that were first debuted in 1933. Currently, the Rockettes are still wearing a version of this costume. I will also mention that years ago, I had the opportunity to tour the back stage costume storage area to see all their iconic Rockette costumes up close.

During this year's performance, I particularly enjoyed their latest 'icicle' costumes that include 3 slightly different dresses, done in a purple, blue and turquoise. And thought back to the light blue 'icicle' dresses that Satin

Stitches created for 'our' Minnesota Illuminaires several years ago (before the new Rockettes version!). These Rockette 'icicle' costumes could easily dance a Latin routine. Inspirational costumes can be modified to fit many dance performance styles, so when looking for inspiration for your new dance costume – keep in mind that inspiration could be found almost anywhere! Creativity is based on visual sparks – something will set the ideas flowing to inspire your imagination.

And we all need extra inspiration during our Minnesota winters, so get out there and do and see and let the inspirations flow!
