

# American Style dominates the 12th MINNESOTA OPEN

Not even the coincidental weekend National Convention of the NRA, which gobbled up immense numbers of hotel rooms, or the beautiful Spring weather in Minneapolis on May 20-22, were able to lessen the enjoyment of the hundreds attending the Twelfth MINNESOTA OPEN Ballroom Dance Competition. With semifinals required, American Style events overwhelmed the International. It's difficult at times to understand the swings in interest and popularity of some of the dances. A few years ago Rhythm dances were king. This year it was Smooth & Standard, with the American style dominant. The featured Pro events were better filled than the Amateur or Pro/Am.

Overall entries were up. Some 30 studios/in-dependents represented by 45 teachers and 140 students/amateurs participated in the 2-1/2 day event. This year saw almost 25% of the entries coming from Canadians, making the "Open" truely an international event. The distinguished Judging panel was chaired by NDCA Treasurer and USISTD past president Dennis Rogers, with Jacqueline Rogers, Ann Harding, Kerry Wilson, David Kloss and Tom Patterson. All are past champions. Mr. Patterson served also as NDCA Observer. Jeff Carlsen was the Scrutineer.

Anticipation of a new alignment in the local Amateur ranks, since the breakup of several sucessful partnerships recenly, was lessened quite a bit when the entries in the Amateur events proved to be rather limited. NELS PETERSEN and his new partner HEIDI SMITH were edged out by HUB NELSON & MONICA MOHN in the threecouple STANDARD final. HUB & MONICA also triumphed in the 6-couple American SMOOTH and the 4-couple Pre-Championship STANDARD finals. NELS was quite impressive with Jennifer Foster in the Pro/Am & Exhibition events as was ex-partner LISA ERICKSON with Paul Botes. The new partnership of BOBBY TARNOWSKI & DONNA EDELSTEIN looked good as runners-up in the Open STANDARD, as did JEFF CHINN & CELIA MULLEN in placing 3rd. It was a delight to see BILL & BEA BEDDOR, the Senior STANDARD winners, dancing as a couple rather than in the Pro/Am as in years past.

SCOTT & AMY ANDERSON of Bloomington FADS won the Pro American Smooth, and JESSE SMITH & LYNDA PRICE of the AMDS Minneapolis captured the Pro Rhythm title.

Moist eyes and lumps in the throat of most of the spectators, who then gave a standing ovation, rewarded the efforts of student BILL WILSON and teacher SHIRLEY CARON, as Bill got up out of his wheelchair and fulfilled a lifelong ambition to dance in a competition. We who value the unlimited use of our bodies and legs to dance, salute the courage and determination of Bill and Shirley. Our Star Awards reflected our admiration. Later in talking to Bill, he said he was looking forward to next year, but didn't know how he'd top this year.

The Saturday evening session was sold out as new champions were crowned and the throng attending rose to their feet to applaud the 10-dance performance by LINDA ETHIER and SERGE OUELETTE of Montreal. This exciting young couple had turned pro less than a year ago, but their polished presentation belied that fact. During their Latin show, Serge apologized to the crowd for his limited English, then "sang" in Spanish! (Actually he mimed the song). This was not just a recital of competition routines, but rather, a well thought out and practiced performance. Their show also made use of some very modern latin music in the best French Canadian mode. Well done, they are to be commended; certainly they should be seen a lot more.

USABDA Minnesota Chapter members once again were prominent among the volunteers who helped with the various unsung jobs necessary to the running of a competition. Thanks to them and to all those who made this another great event.
