

## Twin Cities Open Ballroom Dance Competition Review

Despite frigid temperatures, the **Twin Cities Open Ballroom Competition** (Feb. 2-4) drew competitors from all over the country making it the largest ballroom competition ever in Minnesota! The competition, held once again at the beautiful **Minneapolis Convention Center**, was witness to many "debuts' in partnerships, studios, and the much anticipated **Dancers Cup Circuit**.

In partnerships... we saw new and wonderful partnerships.

Amateur couple Andy Nordberg and Janie Sorhelm coached by Nathan Daniels took a Bronze medal in the hotly contested Amateur Smooth Scholarship! Participating in T.C.O. for the first time were some very talented Amateur couples from outside Minnesota such as Tom & Pat Schinabeck from Appleton, WI who won the Amateur Smooth Scholarship; and Mike & Luci Slywka from Ohio who were Top Amateur Couple! It is always the organizer's goal to bring more Amateur Couples to the Midwest to compete against Minnesota's own talented contingency of amateur dancers, so it was nice to see.

In the Professional ranks, we saw new professional partnerships from outside Minnesota choose the Twin Cities Open to make their debut. Paul Holmes & Wendi Davies (NY) won the Open Standard Competition. Paul was a top dancer from England, and Wendi is a former U. S. Champion and daughter of dance legend Bill Davies who was one of the adjudicators. Also in the Standard Competition was Dale Pizzitola & Ann Zabinski (WI) who won the Rising Star Standard, and took Bronze in the Open Standard. Dan Rutherford & Nicole Collins (IN/MO), took the Bronze in the Open Rhythm Competition. Teka Rae & Scott Lazorov (PA) took the Silver. Michael Wirtanen & Amy Palowski (WI), took the Silver in the Rising Star Rhythm Competition.

The Twin Cities Open was also the inaugural competition in the new Dancers Cup Circuit. The Dancers Cup consists of six competitions around the country in which students, teachers, and amateur couples accumulate points toward cash prizes totaling \$30,000! Competitors who participated in T.C.O. have already begun accumulating points! It's so easy to do – just participate in at least three of the six comps on the Dancers Cup Circuit! They include the St. Louis Star Ball (March 7-10); Wisconsin State (Apr.11-14); Maryland Invitational (June 7-9); Heart of America (Aug. 8-11); and the Constitution

State Champ's (Sept. 26-29). For details call Amy Anderson at 431-0936. Current top point contenders from Minnesota are: Teachers - Paul Botes & Sandra Botes; Students - Phil Schloss & Marcella Groh; and Amateur Couple - Bill & Bea Beddor.

A real highlight was a wonderful presentation from amateurs **Tom Severson & Julianne Mossak**. Always a crowd pleaser was their energetic Polka. They also performed a wonderful interpretive number which really shows their versatility. Saturday evening included the much anticipated **Unforgetable Award** presentation, which goes to someone who has become a great ambassador of the art and sport of ballroom dancing in Minnesota. Past recipients include Marcella Groh, Oliver "Sarge" Schader, and Mary Quinlan. This year the award went to **Bea Beddor**.

Overall, the Twin Cities Open was a wonderful display of great ballroom dancing at every level. The premise on which these competitions are organized is to bring to Minnesota the caliber competitions that we Minnesotans, used to have to travel to. The success of the Twin Citiles Open, however begins right here with our own professional and amatuer dancers. I want to personally "thank" those of you who competed in T.C.O. or volunteered your time to help.







Lots of music and dancing. The dance floors are small and are crowded after the evening show, but by the first intermission, there was room to dance. Four hosts kept the singles dancing.


