5th ANNUAL GRAND BALL A HUGE SUCCESS!!!

On September 24, 1995 the Greenway Ballroom at the Minneapolis Hyatt Regency Hotel was sprinkled with colorful balloons, small twinkling lights, ballgowns and tuxedos, which made for a very festive atmosphere. Mark Weiss, the DJ, spun four hours of fabulous music for everyone's dancing enjoyment. "The World of Dance" showcased unique types of dancing as well as smooth and latin ballroom dancing. The expertise of all the Twin Cities dancers was exceptional.

Our showcase began with Nels Petersen & Theresa Kimler asking everyone to relax for awhile and envision themselves as a USABDA member from another state. Tsha Jacobson, artistic director at On Your Toes School of Dance showcased six of her students from the Teen Hip Hop Jazz Performing Company. The teens who performed were: Courtney Drasner, Jordan Kitzman, Karla Petit, Paige Powers, Becca Schultheis and Lea Right.

The less-common Latino dance, salsa, was performed by a new instructor in the Twin Cities area. Rebecca Trost, owner and director of Four Seasons Dancing on the Nicollet Mall in Minneapolis, and her two partners, Jean Ockuly and Andre' Prucell performed a salon salsa called, "Three Way Salsa Fantasy."

National and world country western competitors, **Tom** and **Diane Larkin** from Eden Prairie, performed a showstopping two-step. Their eye-catching costumes and quick, snappy actions, including a spectacular hat exchange, kept the audience spellbound as they whirled around the floor.

Five members of the Jawaahir Dance Company performed an Egyptian Gypsy dance, known as Ghawazee. The finger cymbals worn by the dancers gave a rhythmic sound as they danced barefoot on the ballroom floor. The performers were: Patricia Auch, Sarah Harrell, Catherine Liska, Kathy McCurdy and Helen Voelker.

The Twin Cities West Coast Swing Club was represented by two groups of dancers. Three couples: Dolores Houle & Ray Stiff, Jim Aubrecht & Mary Jean Lundeen, and Eric Remsen & Charlotte Strom performed traditional West Coast Swing patterns. A second performance by Lowell & Jean Branstrom, Gary Ott & Michelle Baker, Ken & Hope Lindquist, and Judy Schaber & Jay Carlson presented competition styling of West Coast Swing.

Colleen Rudnicki, owner of Dancin' Feet Studio of Coon Rapids and five of her teenage students showed us the same fast-pace clogging which they performed in July at Opryland in Nashville, TN. The girls who just began dancing together in May, were the envy of all, recieving more applause than anyone! The teens who performed with Colleen were: Kristi Montgomery, Amber Tonn, Amy Kovarik, Tracy Steele and Kelly Bitty.

A Country Solo Medley, of waltz, jazz and swing, was performed by 14-year-old, **Kristina Taylor**. In January 1995, she competed with her Country Western instructor, **Tom Larkin** at the World Competition in Disneyland, CA. Her comment for the Grand Ball was, "I had a blast and I think I'll start my friends dancing!"

The Rhythm & Swing dancers under the direction of swing dance instructor, Cindy Geiger, performed the flashy "dancer's jam" at lightning speed. The action never stopped as one or more couples took the floor to showcase the 8-count lindy-hop sequences, interspersed with aerials. 



Minnesota wins BIG at USBC

It's the dream of every serious competitive ballroom dancer to become a U.S. Champion. This title is conferred to amateurs, pro-ams and professionals at the USBC- **United States Ballroom Championships** This year's competition was held from September 5-9 in Miami Beach, Florida.

Because national titles are at stake USBC is probably the most tension-filled and exhausting comp in the U.S. There are daytime and evening sessions for five straight days. Many evenings run well past midnight and the daytime sessions can start as early as 9:00AM. This year's USBC had 54 judges and five scrutineers judging 3550 entries. It takes stamina to spectate as well as compete!

USBC is an odd competition. It's exciting to see who makes the 12, then final six in championship events, and who capture the titles. But it's also a frustrating comp. Entries are expensive as are tickets to the ballroom. Pro-am and amateur one-dance events in the closed syllabus categories are not very well attended. The floor is split in half with the competitions occurring simultaneously. Snezana Potter remarked that she was disappointed that there were so few competitors in her silver Latin division. Because the comp is five days long and no one can watch dancing sixteen hours a day, the ballroom can be quite empty-- which is not what one might expect at USBC.

For championship events, however, it's a wonderful comp. Everyone who's anyone competes at USBC. All the couples you read about in <u>Dance Beat</u> and <u>Dance Week</u> attend-- so it's a good chance to see the range of U.S. competitors. There are also "Open to the World" championships which provide the opportunity to see top couples from Europe, Australia and Asia, as well as North America.

Minnesota couples in all categories, amateur, pro-am and pro, had an unprecedented outstanding year.

In the Amateur American style both amateur championships were won by couples from the Twin Cities. American Smooth was won by Bobby Tarnowski & Monica Mohn. Runners up were Gary & Carol Stroick. In the amateur American Rhythm only two couples were entered but Nels Petersen & Theresa Kimler convincingly won for the second year in a row.

The Amateur Theater Arts which was an Open to the World event was won by a couple from England with Gary & Carol placing second to become the highest ranking U.S. couple.

The open Amateur Standard Championship had 32 couples with 26 of them from outside the U.S. Masimo Georgianni & Alessia Manfredini of Italy won. In the open Amateur Latin there were 39 couples-- 33 foreign and 6 American; all six of them from New York. The winners were Carsten Krause & Petra Wasikowski of Germany. No Americans made either final.

In the **Pro Am Ladies American Smooth** division four out of five possible championships were won by Minnesotans:

Ladies B Donna Edelstein with John Berry
Ladies C Pat Kingston with Scott Anderson
Ladies C2 Bea Beddor with Scott Anderson

Bill Beddor won the **Pro-Am Men's C2 Smooth** championship with Amy Anderson.

In the Pro-Am American Rhythm Theresa Kimler with Robert Foster won the Ladies A, and Bea Beddor with Scott Anderson the Ladies C2. In the Men's Rhythm division Nels Petersen won with Jennifer Foster. The Men's Pro-Am Theater Arts was won by Jim Baker, also with Jennifer Foster.

In the Pro-Am International Standard Donna Edelstein with John Berry won the Ladies B championship and Bea Beddor with Scott Anderson the Ladies C2.

The **Pro-Am International Latin** Ladies B championship was won by **Donna Edelstein** with Perry Gingerich.

Gary & Diana McDonald won the International 10-Dance Championship for the second year in a row by placing 6th in the Standard and 2nd in the Latin. In the Professional International Standard Timothy & Michele Mason danced the best I've seen them, and were marked harshly to place 4th in the U.S. Victor Veyrasset & Heather Smith of California retained their title. Victor has won this championship six times previously-- once before with Heather as well as with two other partners.
