



Held at the American Classic Ballroom, the all-day workshop encompassed rhumba, cha-cha, swing, waltz, foxtrot and tango, as well as covering the elements of style. The students enjoyed five hours of lessons and a dance in the evening, which included a fantastic show by Carol & Gary Stroick, Ellen Neuman & Jack Cain, Karen Kettler & Mark Tepley, and Theresa Kimler & Nels Petersen.

The students came to the workshop from Macalester College in St. Paul and Iowa State University in Ames, They were at all different levels of dance, ranging from only a few weeks of lessons to a few years. They enjoyed the workshop and meeting each other, and the Iowa students had the added benefit of being a little more prepared for the Dancing Illini Competition being held at the end of this month at the University of Illinois-Champaign/Urbana.

The purpose of the workshops, in general, is to bring college ballroom dancers together in a general awareness of each other and of what can be accomplished together. This general awareness can lead to many things, some of which include more friendships and better dancing, but which can also include intercollegiate competitions. Since there is essentially very little intercollegiate activity in the Twin Cities area, the workshops are designed to give the collegiates a chance to meet each other and discover the fun times to be had.

Intercollegiate activity is growing rapidly in the United States and abroad. All over the world, college dance groups get together for dances, workshops and competitions. And, as people are already aware, ballroom dancing is now an exhibition sport in the Olympics. One of the focuses of USABDA is to get our younger generation involved in ballroom dancing. USABDA-Minnesota has a College/Youth program for that purpose that tries to involve not only college students, but also high school and younger. As yet there are only a few, if any, ballroom dance clubs in the high schools around the Twin Cities, but there are a number of them on the east coast. This is a definite portent of what is to be here in Minnesota. After all, the nation was started in the east and expanded to the west, so ballroom dancing at the college and high school level will undoubtedly do the same.

Looking Your Best-- For Any Reason

Attitude has always been nine-tenths of the law when creating a look with hair and makeup, and attitudes are changing. As owner of ILLUSIONS I simply want to help women find themselves-- or at least their own look.

Hair and makeup has to enhance a woman and her own identity. I'm all for emphasizing what she's got, rather than forcing strands of hair to bend to the will of a blow dryer, or recreating her facial structure with blush and eyeshadow.

MAKEUP:

FOUNDATION: The most individualized makeup you can wear. The goal is to match skin as closely as possible. Once blended, it should literally disappear into the skin. (Remember, color should come from blush and lips, not foundation.)

POWDER: Five reasons to powder:. It finishes a bare face. It blends and corrects makeup. It sets makeup. It promotes longevity. It stops shine.

BLUSH: Contouring is for cameras. In real life the point of blush is to add color to the face, not to reshape it. Try a neutral shade for daytime and a darker shade for evening.

EYESHADOW. Experimenting with color is fine, but for your basic face, work with neutrals. Evening and special occasion is a great time to go all out. Eyes are highly expressive, they're also highly individual. That's why you need to evaluate your shape before you apply shadow. This will help you determine where you need to create depth (with darker tones) and where you need to lift, or highlight (using lighter tones.)

MASCARA: Black mascara is makeup's little black dress-- It looks good on everyone. For a softer look try brown/black.

LIPS: Last but not least, lipstick should match your mood and not your clothes. Lipstick is emotional and expressive. A simple change of lipstick can transform the basic face-- and, in the process, your whole attitude.

HAIR

Hairstyles are as individual if not more so than makeup. So it's important to go with a style that enhances your look without getting caught in a time warp because you're afraid of change. Again for everyday, the best look is a natural one emphasizing healthy, well-maintained hair. But what do you do when you want a romantic, glamorous, elegant look for that special occasion? Here are ideas for different looks that are easy to do on your own. And remember, practice makes perfect.

ROMANTIC TRESSES: That big-night-out look is simple when you go for a design like this. Dab heat-protectant on locks, then wrap around hot rollers. After setting, unroll and fingertousle using a bit of holding spray. For fullness, backcomb.

GLAMOROUS: For the short-haired people sleek and smooth is a great way to go. Using a setting lotion or gel, blow dry down and under with a vent brush. For the lift in back, use a hot set, then backcomb the crown area. Tremendous!

ELEGANT: If an elegant up-do is your desired style here's an easy way to achieve that look in under 10 minutes. After setting your hair with lotion and hot rollers, tousle curls loosely. Start from bottom of neckline and twist hair upward towards crown of head for a French twist effect. Bobbypin going up the twist until you reach the top where the extra curled hair can be pinned loosely at the top and on the side for a very elegant up-do. Style the front as desired.

If all else fails, smile!
