

For a 150-pound person, the foxtrot, waltz and rhumba burn 3.5 calories per minute... the cha cha, swing and mambo 7.0 cpm, and the twist or lambeda over 11! Of course space may be a consideration, and your neighbors might wonder, but just pretend that you're practicing for a demo on a really small dance floor.


SUMMER SOUNDS AT THE BEACH


