

2005 Nationals: MN Dominates Smooth & Nine-Dance Championships

The 2005 USA DanceSport National Championships were held right here in Minnesota, at the Roy Wilkins Auditorium in St. Paul, August 12th through 14th. This was the fourth and final year Minnesota got to host the Nationals, which will be in San Jose, in 2006. A whopping forty-four Minnesotans competed. Local coach Paul Botes lent wit and elegance to the event as Master of Ceremonies.

For the 11th year in a row, a MN couple won the Nine Dance Championship. Showcasing the mixture of precision and passion that make their dancing so exciting to watch, the Nordbergs easily secured their sixth Nine Dance title. Also dancing beautifully in this event were Minnesotans Tom Thornquist with Debbie Rines, and Ken Kendle with Eileen Arcilla. Ken and Eileen won the Pre-Champ Rhythm title, and placed highly in many other events.

Thirteen couples vied for the National Adult Smooth title. Luckily the heat was broken up into two groups, but the floor was still crowded in places due to the large

movements of smooth dancing. Andy Nordberg took a startling tumble after being tripped in the Semi-Final, but was able to quickly recover his poise. He and Janie ended up in 4th place, improving one place upon their 2004 ranking of 5th in the nation. Nels Petersen and Theresa Kimler, as anyone who has ever had the pleasure of watching them could have predicted, placed first in all dances, becoming the new National Smooth Champions.

Turquoise and hot pink were very much in fashion in the Senior I Smooth Championship. I counted three hot pink dresses and three turquoise in the eleven couple semi-final. All three women with hot pink dresses made the final, and

stayed near to each other in the Waltz and Tango, so that I half-expected them to begin dancing in a formation. Jeannie Schmit stood out in a stunning green dress with a high slit that emphasized her perfect leg action. The crowd cheered wildly as she and David were crowned Senior I Smooth Champions for the third year in a row. Minnesota utterly dominated this event, with three local couples securing top places: Mark and Karen Tepley placed 4th, and Tom and Anne LaTourelle came in 2nd.

This year, besides showcasing our traditional strength in American style dancing, Minnesota also achieved a first in International Latin when Gene Bersten and Zhanna Vayntrub made the quarter final of the Adult Championship. Minnesota is lucky to have such talented dancers putting us on the map in Latin.

My partner Tom and I had a chance to talk with the nine time winners and current champions of this event,

Eugene Katsevman and Maria Manusova. I wanted to know if they knew they'd win. They politely said only that they tried to

dance well and do their best. I pressed further, asking if they were at all concerned about Valentin Chmerkovskiy and Valeriya Kozharinova, who recently won the Youth Latin at Blackpool and who ended up coming in second to Eugene and Maria in the Adult Championship. "No," Maria said. I waited a moment, trying to entice her into filling the silence, but she held her ground. "Is there an off season?" Tom asked. They found the question amusing and smiled as they told us they have some big competitions coming up and won't be taking any time off.

Thank you to everyone who came out to cheer on our Minnesota couples. Those of you who missed Nationals still have a chance to see some of the best amateur ballroom dancing in the country at Ballroom Blast, which will be held Saturday, October 29 at 4 pm and 7:30 pm in the Richfield High School Theater. Call 612-240-5042 for tickets.

Editors Note: While this was the first Adult Smooth Championship for Nels and Theresa, in the past years they have won Adult Rhythm nine times, and Nine Dance four times.

The Northwest Regional Championship Competition, which was held July 2-3, 2005, is a cozy affair - only 100 or so couples. Do not, however, be fooled by the numbers. The Seattle chapter puts on a big show.

The Sea-Tac Hotel and Conference Center provides plush accommodations and 5-star dining. The ballroom is nearly filled by the Olympic-sized dance floor, but there are still plenty of tables and bleacher seats available. The list of judges looks like a page straight out of a Nationals program.

Competitors sign up via the O2CM Online/Onsite Competition Manager website, pioneered by Seattle chapter president and veteran competitor Mark Tabor. In addition to warp-speed registration, O2CM offers competitors an unprecedented benefit: instant results. Imagine finishing the last dance of a final round and walking off the floor with your awards in hand. No problem for O2CM. Each judge enters his/her marks directly into the scrutineer's computer by means of a wireless handheld keypad. A few seconds later the computer chews up all the marks and spits out the placements. Janis and I are accustomed to a few hours of nail biting and self-reproach before we hear the verdict. Welcome to the 21st century.

ON THE TOWN with Lois Donnay



Trying that new place...

o, you've been religiously reading the great column by that very talented new social columnist, and now you want to try out that new hot spot that she talked about. It's your kind of music, and the crowd sounds like they would be fun. You dress in your best cross-functional outfit, maybe call a friend or two, and head out. Arriving at your new hangout, you pick a nice mid-section table, and sit and wait for the welcoming crowd.

The place looks great! Lots of people having a great time; some really good dancers; music that's upbeat and danceable. There's only one small problem. You seem to have become invisible.

Ouch! So, after selecting some particularly choice adjectives for the imbecile who suggested this joint in the first place, you gather your dignity and head out. You maybe even make a vow to stick to the warm soothing atmosphere of the dance studio from now on, with your regular partner who merely yells at you for screwing up, but always dances with you.

So we are resigned to this. But why? We daredevils who willingly ski, skydive, bungee-jump, smoke, drive 494 during rush hour, and do all other kinds of things that put our bodies in grave danger, are scared to death to endanger the one thing that can't kill us – our feelings.

You're right – when you go to a new place for the first time, everyone is stuck up. Why shouldn't they be? They don't know you. They don't know if you're there to hand out your pamphlets or just got turned around at the group home outing. You haven't showed your worth – paid your dues. What are the dues? Time and conversation.

One of the big problems with social dancing is the total dependence on other social dancers. Even if you hate the music, the bartenders are rude, the cover charge is exorbitant, the patrons lack manners, and the person who broke your heart still shows up, you have to go. Why? Because that's where the dancers are – the ones you know, and who know you.

Remember, my goal is to get everybody to go out dancing more. But I do get people who claim that they visited places I recommended, and they didn't feel welcome. (The second most common complaint is the music was too fast – or too slow. At the same place. On the same night). My advice – give that place another shot, screw up your courage and talk to someone. And of course, if you need a better "in" than that, just tell 'em Lois sent you. It may not help, but at least they'll know you can read.

ASK DR. DANCE

Paul and Donna are World Class Judges and popular coaches who can be reached at 763-557-6004.

What level of dancer do you need to be in order to attend some of the organized dances here in town? USABDA for example has dances but my impression is their lessons and dances are fairly advanced. I have only taken a dozen or so group lessons and no private lessons.

She Said:

It can be very intimidating to be a new dancer at USABDA and studio events. In the beginning it can seem like everyone but you knows how to dance – and knows a lot of dances. I've had some new students go to a dance, peek in the door and leave because they felt so outclassed.

My feeling is that once you know how to lead or follow about 5 steps in each of the dances you have learned you are ready for a dance. Everyone remembers what it was like when they were new, and most people will accommodate you by leading associate bronze material if you tell them you are a beginner.

If you have only taken group lessons, hopefully you have been exposed to lead/follow techniques. Some groups teach only steps. If you have just memorized steps you will have a tough time. Make sure you are learning how to lead or follow so that dancing can be fun!

Then go out there, relax, be willing to make some mistakes, and start enjoying your dancing! ■






Another Fantastic Dance Extravaganza!


On May 28, 2005, we lost one of our dear dancer friends after a long battle with cancer. Mary Jean Lundeen was 76 years old and oh so vivacious!
