History of The Tropicana Club

The original Tropicana Club was opened in 1939 in a Havana suburban neighborhood estate, the Villa Mina. Cuban impresario, Victor de Correa provided the food and entertainment while partners Rafael Mascaro and Luis Bulgar operated the casino in the chandeliered dining room of the mansion.

In 1951, Martin Fox, a well connected gambler with questionable underworld ties, bought out the original owners. The Tropicana thereafter underwent massive renovations leading to the lush paradise atmosphere for which it gained its international fame.

The show girls, "Las Diosas de Carne" became famous around the world for their sequined/ feathered shows. Headliners during the 1950's included Tito Puente, Xavier Cugat, Paul Robeson, Carmen Miranda, and

Josephine Baker.

Unfortunately, the Cuban Revolution changed everything as all casino and hotel properties were nationalized. The various principal owners fled to the U.S., or were captured and imprisoned.

But, The Tropicana survived and is still in business today, attracting a largely tour group crowd. Cabaret shows take place in the open air salon, weather permitting.

Members are welcome to bring their own wine (only) to our dinner dances. The **OHCC** corking fee is \$10.00.

This is my first newsletter as the Let's Dance Club Board Chairperson following your affirmation vote at the November dance. Thank you for your support. Additionally, I want to thank Past President Frank Deeter and Past Membership Chair, John Wilson for their dedication to the club. And I want to thank all members and guests who attended the November 11th Veterans Day "Dance Canteen"! A special tribute was made to our member veterans and the Debbie Bailes Band played many tunes from the 1940's. Thanks go to Madge and Frank Deeter for hosting the event.

The By-Laws were changed in September for the office of President to become Chairperson of the Club Board. The other 3 elected Board members are now the Finance Chairperson, Membership Chairperson and the Publicity Chairperson with all four Chairpersons having an equal say in how the Club functions. Members attending the upcoming February dance will be asked to vote on additional By-Laws changes that clarify these board roles.

As Board Chairperson, my initial focus will be to attract new members. The Let's Dance Club was founded in 1982 and a few of the founding members are still

dancing with us. However,

there has been a decline in membership and participation to support our dance events.

To make it easier to attract new members, I will pursue a change in the By-Laws to shorten the time it takes for a guest to become a member. Currently, after being nominated by a member, then attending two dance events with the member sponsor, the nomination is voted on at the next dance event. This process to membership could easily take 6 to 9 months or more. The proposed By-Laws change will greatly shorten and simplify this process. With the proposed change, a potential new member who attends a first dance event with their member sponsor can obtain a member application at that time. Upon attending a second dance with their sponsor, they can submit their application, sponsor statement, and membership dues. The guest candidate will then be introduced during intermission as a new club member.

In the By-Laws, Article II, "Membership", it states the two requirements for Membership are: I., Persons who have a good basic knowledge of ballroom dancing shall be eligible for membership, and 2., Any person considered for membership in this club must be nominated by a member in good standing. The requirements for membership are unchanged. But it will now be

the responsibility of the sponsoring member to vouch for his/her member candidate's basic dance knowledge. The need for an affirmation vote is thus eliminated.

In the past year, the Board has successfully responded to member suggestions to improve the menu and the dinner service provided by Old Hickory Country Club, our dance venue for the past 10 years. Also, there is a different band for each event plus one DI per year to allow dancing to a variety of music selections. The fixed costs for each dinner dance are the band and the rental for the OHCC ballroom. Getting sufficient attendance at each dinner dance to cover these fixed costs is critical to the future of the Club. If your membership lapsed but you are now interested in attending, contact Madonna Archer. Or, simply send in the attached reservation form. The club would love to see you again!

I strongly encourage members to attend the February 24th dinner dance and to commit early so plans can proceed. I also challenge each member to bring one or more guests. Guests with or without a dance partner are welcome. And guests are welcome to apply for membership if they enjoy their experience. A bottle of wine will be awarded to the member who brings the most guests!

41 attendees were present at the November Dinner/ Dance, comprised of 30 members and 11 guests.

The Club currently has 47 paid members.

The current bank balance is \$2,215.30, after paying the

Club's liability insurance premium due January 1, 2018.

Paid cost for the November dance was \$2,360.52, a shortfall of \$515.52 after deducting reservation income.
