Aces Grille—6847 Pearl Rd., Middleburg Heights, OH 44130, 440-845-1800; also 32650 Lorain Rd., North Ridgeville, OH 44039, 440-327-3333; <http://www.acesgrille.com/>. They move tables around to create a dance floor. Stone cobbled floor that got a bit sticky, but the food was good (try the calzones!) and there was room to dance! There is a North Ridgeville and Middleburg Heights location (we have been to both—both locations have dance floor space!). Both floor conditions are about the same.
Amy rating: ★★★ (Middleburg Heights location first visited July 2013; North Ridgeville location visited sometime in 2012)

The Boneyard Beer Farm & Mesquite Grill-- 101 East Royalton Road, Broadview Hts., OH 44147; 440-717-WING; <http://www.boneyardusa.com/> Odd concrete dance floor in front of the band (dancers on the same level as the band). Actually, there isn't a designated dance floor; however, there is space for 6-8 couples to dance between the band and the pool tables. They have mostly rock bands here. We did not have any food (fly-by dancing—we put our coats on one of the pool tables and danced to a few songs until the break and then left).

Amy rating: ★★ (visited November 2012)

Brew House Bar & Grill—6395 Pearl Rd., Parma Heights, OH 44130; 440-345-5815; <https://www.facebook.com/pages/Brew-House-Bar-Grill/551013911641490>.

Brothers Lounge, 11609 Detroit Ave., Cleveland, OH 44102-2342; 216-226-2767. <http://www.brotherslounge.com/> They have live entertainment many nights of the week. This is a cool venue for beer, wine and martini. The stage is great for the band, but the beautiful wooden floor is usually covered with tables ☹. If anyone has encountered a better dance floor, let me know!

Amy rating: ★ (visited, umm, can't remember, long time ago)

Carrie Cerino's-- 8922 Ridge Road, North Royalton, OH 44133; 440-237-3434, <http://www.carriecerinos.com/Events/LoungeBands.aspx> Nice wood dance floor downstairs with good bands every Friday and Saturday; usually attracts a lot of dancers. Good food, too! Generally gets pretty crowded. Ed is not fond of the crowded floor, even though it can probably fit >10 couples. We have not been there for several years.

Amy rating: ★★★ (can't remember the last time I've been there!)

C Mulligan's Pub-- 6450 Pitts Blvd, North Ridgeville, OH 44039; (440) 327-9108. A bit of a hole in the wall; the floor in front of the band that could comfortably fit about 6 couples, unless the band spreads out their equipment over the floor. They were not serving food when we got there. The crowd was nice, and we liked the band! We don't think they served any food.

Amy rating: ★★ (last visited April 2013)

Catalina West--24481 Detroit Rd. Westlake OH 44145; 440-835-3559; www.catalinawestlake.com (not yet working). This is the old SB 81, now serving SoCal mod Mex food! There is still a dance floor (now on the upper floor, close to the patio (fits about 4-6 couples). Ed and thought the entrees were mediocre, but the appetizers served at the other table looked good. The service was inattentive.

Amy rating: ★★ (visited June 2014)

Fairview Tavern--21867 Lorain Rd Cleveland, OH 44126; (440) 799-4200; <http://thefairviewtavern.com/> They often have good live bands here, so Ed and I thought we'd visit. Unfortunately, there really is no dance floor (although a few people dance in a teeny space that is really a passage from the kitchen to the dining area! The food was delicious and the wait staff was very nice. However, because of the lack of dance floor, I really can't recommend this venue as a good dance restaurant. However, if you like great food and great music, then this is a great place!

Amy rating: ★ (last visited February 2013)

Fat Little Buddies-- 26906 Cook Road Olmsted, OH 44138; (440) 235-1338; <http://www.thefatlittlebuddies.com/> A hole in the wall, but a good size (vinyl?) dance floor for a bar in the back room (but little seating)—about an 8 couple floor. One of our favorite bands (Bradford White) plays here—we couldn't find a seat, so we danced to a break and left. We didn't try any of the food. A bit of a weird atmosphere (OK, maybe it was a bit late, and people had been drinking a while).

Amy rating: ★★ (visited spring 2012)

The GetAway Pub—1462 North Portage Path, Akron, OH 44313; 330-867-8700; <http://www.thegetawaypub.com/> Looks like a hole in the wall, but they have a good space for a band and a wooden dance floor (6-8 couple)! The food is OK; not too much seating. Come early; it gets crowded. Ed and I only come here when our favorite Akron area band, the Fabulous Voices, play here. Otherwise, I do not recognize the other bands that play here.

Amy rating: ★★ (last visited spring 2013)

Grayton Road Tavern—4760 Grayton Road, Cleveland, OH 44135; 216-265-7770; <http://www.graytonroadtavern.com/>. No designated dance floor, but there is space to dance (maybe 2-3 couples) on the smooth concrete floor. The food was great—Ed thought his burger was one of the best that he has had; the wait staff was friendly. The night that we visited, The Ohio State University football game delayed the band start time, and a huge birthday party occupied most of the tables. The acoustics of the venue were not the most conducive to bands (it was difficult to understand the lyrics because the sound bounced off of the high ceilings and walls). However, we plan to go back!

Amy rating: ★★ (first visited September 2013)

Holiday Inn Cleveland/Independence, 6001 Rockside Road, Independence, OH 44131; 216-524-8050. Great wood dance floor with dance bands playing Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. It gets crowded on Friday and Saturday; however, the dancers come on Wednesday and Thursday—a lot of swing and hustle. It is being newly renovated during January 2014.

Amy rating: ★★★ (last visited 12/26/13)

Hooley House, Brooklyn--10310 Cascade Crossing Brooklyn, OH 44144; (216) 362-7700; <http://www.1funpub.com/> This was the old Don Pancho's. There is a wooden floor that they have to shift tables to create a dance floor when they have bands. A night that we went in 2012, there was room for maybe three couples; however, there was no seating (a large party was occupying the dining room), so we did not stay. Upon a return visit, the floor had room for 6-8 couples to fit comfortably on the floor. The floor was wood, but was "sticky" for dancing—turning is difficult. I had the spinach salad, which was great! The serving staff was excellent!

Amy rating: ★★★ (last visited March 2014)

Hooley House Westlake—24940 Sperry Dr., Westlake, OH 44145; 440-835-2890. A different layout than the Brooklyn Hooley House; their dance floor is smaller—may be enough for two couples. Ed and I enjoyed the band and the food, but we didn't dance.

Amy rating: ★★ (last visited May 2014)

Jocko's Bar & Grill--1100 West Royalton Road Broadview Hts., OH 44147; (440) 877-2622; <http://www.jockosbarandgrill.com/> Dance wood floor is not bad for a bar, but not very big (maybe about 8 x 12 feet with a rounded off edge)—enough for 5-6 couples who don't take up a lot of space with dancing. We didn't eat, but was told the food was good (the menu looked tasty!). Crowd tends to be younger (well, than me and Ed); very crowded and noisy (I put in ear plugs to protect my ears). They have a good mix of dance and rock bands.
Amy rating: ★★ (visited November 2012)

Otani Restaurant and Pub—180 West Streetsboro St., Hudson, OH 44236; 330-656-0012; <http://www.otanihudson.com/> Great wood dance floor—just the right amount of “slide” for our shoes; except it is small. The bands play in the bar area, but they can move the tables. However, if there are a lot of people in the bar, they stand around on the dance floor! We ate dinner with John and Yan—the food was tasty. We enjoyed the lively crowd. Apparently bands entertain every Saturday.
Amy rating: ★★ (visited March 2014)

Panini's Bar and Grill--8870 Darrow Rd, Twinsburg, OH 44087; (330) 963-0095; www.paninisgrill.com/locations/twinsburg/ A bit of an odd set up for bands—the stage faces a small area of the restaurant, and the sight lines to watch the band for other patrons is poor. The staff clears tables to provide space for a dance floor (it is wood!). The menu is extensive and the food is good. Ed and I saw Cocktail Johnny on the night of our visit. After they cleared three tables, about 6-8 people could fit on the dance floor (although you would need to depend on people to vacate the tables before they make room on the floor!).
Amy rating: ★★★ (visited 5/10/14)

The Parkview NiteClub--1261 West 58th Street, Cleveland, OH; 216-961-1341; <http://www.parkviewniteclub.com/>. Located at the end of West 58th, 3 blocks north of Detroit Avenue; parking in the street. They have bands on Saturdays and decent bar food, too (with a great wait staff)! Unfortunately, they have a postage stamp-sized floor—too bad, because they have good bands here!
Amy rating: ★ (it's been a long time since we've been there)

Parma Tavern—5680 Broadview Road, Parma, OH 44134; 216-635-1800; <http://www.parma-tavern.com/> A slate tile dance floor that can fit 4-6 couples (if they move the tables). They have live bands or DJ every Friday or Saturday. The food and service was good; the people were nice!
Amy rating: ★★ (last visited May 2013)

Rav's Creekside Tap and Grill—9224 Darrow Rd., Twinsburg, OH; 330-425-3435; <http://ravscreekside.biz/> A small dance surface (2-3 couples), but they have good food (we like the chicken fajita salad). We have heard the Benjaminz here twice! The staff and customers are nice, too (and we meet friends here).
Amy rating: ★★ (last visited 5/10/13)

Round House Bar— Delaware Ave, Put-in-Bay, OH 43456; (419) 285-2323; <http://www.theroundhousebar.com/>. We heard the Bluff Canucks (Ed knows the drummer) on a chilly Saturday afternoon (the ferry ride was nauseating because

the wind rocked the boat!). There was a great crowd, but the floor space was small—some people (including us) did find some space to dance!

Amy rating: ★★ (last visited 5/3/14)

Sassy's Bar & Grille—10755 Ravenna Rd., Twinsburg, OH; 330-998-6529; <http://www.sassysbarandgrille.com/> . This is a really friendly place with pretty good food. The floor is a bit small, but there is some room to dance! Ed and I were there on a quiet night to hear the Juke Hounds (they sounded great, by the way—get their new CD Bluesitude), which meant the entire floor was ours!

Amy rating: ★★ (last visited August 2014)

Savannah Bar & Grille--30676 Detroit Road, Westlake, OH 44145; 440-892-2266; <http://thesavannah.com/> After a hiatus as "Rock West," the old Savannah's is back! They have a dedicated dance floor that dancers in the area know and use! The staff and clientele are friendly and the greasy fries have even gotten a little better since they re-opened in March 2013. They have bands on nearly every day of the week!

Amy rating: ★★★ (last visited January 2014)

Scoundrel's Bar & Grill-- 826 Front Street Berea, OH 44017; (440) 234-3455; <http://scoundrelsbarandgrill.com/> The wood dance floor is maybe 10 x 18 feet; up to about 8 couples on the floor. The food is OK and cheap, but the service is slow. They have a mix of good dance bands and rock bands.

Amy rating: ★★★ (last visited 2/1/14)

South East Gears & Cheers Restaurant and Bar-- 23333 Aurora Road, Bedford Heights, OH 44146; 440-232-0029; <http://segearsandcheers.com/> We heard the Benjaminz and ate dinner. They have good food and friendly staff. There is a floor in front of the band that fit several couples—we had a great time dancing! They have an outdoor patio that is used in the summer, so dancing is probably on concrete when the weather is nice.

Amy rating: ★★ (visited March 2014)

StringZ & WingZ--9244 Market Square Drive Streetsboro, OH 44241; <http://www.stringzwingz.com/> . HUGE wood floor, good bands—and good food! The crowd differs, depending on the band; sometimes there are ballroom dancers! Sometimes has a cover charge, sometimes no cover charge (depending on the band). The dining area is separated by a wall from the room with the dance floor and bar, which they call the Z-Plex. The Z-Plex address is 1543 State Route 303, Streetsboro, OH 44241; 330-422-1200;

Thirsty Cowboy--2743 Medina Rd Medina, OH 44256; (330) 722-5400; <http://www.thirstycowboys.com/> Ed and I visited last fall—they have a huge wood floor! Line dancing is taught every Wednesday (starts at 7:30 p.m.), and they have bands on Friday and Saturday. We saw Caliber Band there (we also saw them at the Ribfest last year). I do not know how the food was, since we did not eat there; however, the menu is reasonably priced! The people were nice, too. There is a charge for some of the entertainment (at least there was a cover charge when we went; it was \$5). By the way, they also have a mechanical bull, for those of you who would like to try...

Amy rating: ★★★★ (visited September 2012)

Train Station Bar—424 E. River St., Elyria, OH 44035; 440-322-9503; <http://www.trainstationbar.com/> We came here to listen to a band. It is very cramped and crowded; they serve drinks, but do not have a menu. The dance floor space was very small (parquet wood floor). We were not inspired to dance! They do seem to have a good list of bands, but we would not come here to dance.

Amy rating: ★(last visited March 2014)

Vosh Club--1414 Riverside Dr., Lakewood, Ohio; 216-767-5202; voshlkwd@gmail.com; <http://voshclub.com/> Vosh just opened in March 2013. They say that “the club will feature Jazz, Blues, Motown and more.” They have a substantial stage for bands with cool disco lights; the dance floor looks like it could accommodate about 8 couples? In April, Ed and I poked our heads in the door—there was a cover charge, but nowhere to sit! We did not stay. However, the band sounded good; the dress code is a little more upscale than most of the bars with bands. OK, so we went back in May to hear the band Artefix (great band, by the way). The dance floor could fit about 8-10 couples—but it was a hard marble. Also, we did not think the people were very friendly; the server took our drinks from the table before we were finished (we were on the dance floor to come back to the table and found our table cleaned off even though our coats were still on our chairs!). Drinks are expensive, the food selections are limited, and the kitchen closes at 10:30 p.m.

Amy rating: ★★ (visited May 2013)

West Park Station-- 17015 Lorain Avenue Cleveland, OH 44111 (Kamm's Corners, Cleveland); (216) 476-2000; <http://www.westparkstation.com/> Ed and I came to hear a band; after we found a couple of chairs, no one came to ask if we wanted anything to eat or drink. We left before the band started. The dance floor was very small anyway. The patrons were very young; it was very crowded.

Amy rating: ★ (visited September 2012)

Willoughby Brewing Company (Friday & Saturday) -- 4057 Erie Street Willoughby, Ohio; 440-975-0202; <http://willoughbybrewing.com/entertainment/>. They have a big wood dance floor in front of the band (>10 couple floor), but more deep than wide (rather odd). Good bands every Friday and Saturday. The food is good, but the seating is away from the band. Hard to find a good place to sit and listen.

Amy rating: ★★★ (visited several years ago)

UNRATED (because I haven't been there; but could be promising)

Jilly's Music Room--111 North Main Street, Akron, OH 44308 (used to be Northside); <http://www.jillysmusicroom.com>. The Juke Hounds really like playing at this new venue and encouraged us to see them at their next gig there!

Kickin' Kountry--10997 St Rt 212 NE, Bolivar OH 44612; 330-354-8129. Open Mon thru Sat, 6:30 pm to 2:00 am. DANCE TIPS FORUM:

Okay—this is a new feature to this newsletter. Occasionally, people ask questions about dancing. I thought it might be worth getting your two cents about this question. *Email me with your tips! I'd like to add YOUR two cents, too!*

“How do you decide what dance to do when you hear music?”

- Amy's two cents:
 1. Ask yourself what kind of dances can you do?
 2. Then, ask yourself, does this music “fit”^{*} into any kind of the dances that you do?
 3. Then, count to see if the tempo is suited to the dance that you think might fit. Do you think you can dance it at that speed?
 4. If yes, then, dance it!
 5. Alternate plan: see what other people are dancing and do what looks good to you!

^{*}“Fit” means whether or not the character of the music fits the character of the dance:

"How do I get to dance more at social dances?" (posted 9/12/14)

This one is submitted by Jeanne—thanks for her excellent discussion! She got this tips during a dance class. What are your suggestions (whether you are a follower or a leader)?

- Ask leaders for dances! If you wait until you're asked, you may sit for a while as there are followers who don't mind asking leaders for dances.
- Some leaders may turn you down. They may have already made contact with another follower to dance that song, they might be very hot and tired and need a rest, or they may have a previous arrangement to dance a particular dance with a particular follower. If they are practicing good dance etiquette, they will decline your invitation, but offer to dance a later dance with you.
- Some of the leaders mentioned that they will usually not ask a follower who doesn't look like she wants to dance. She may be involved in a conversation with a friend or two and he doesn't want to interrupt. She may be sitting in the back of the room in a dark corner. She may be looking down and have her arms crossed. Leaders tend to ask followers for dances who are making eye contact, smiling, standing on the side of the dance floor or outright asking them for dances.
