2016 Phoenix DanceSport Challenge An Overview to Amateur Competitive Dancing

What makes a Dancesport Competition?

Dance skills:

A competition allows dancers to show and compare their skills with other dancers at a similar level. It consists of many events, each of which is targeted at a particular style of dance and skill level. Each competitor is required to perform one or more dances from a given division. As competitors move up in skill level, they are required to perform additional dances in their respective category. Not all skill levels or divisions are offered at all competitions.

In the United States, these are the following amateur competitive skill levels:

Closed Syllabus Categories	Open Categories
Bronze * Silver * Gold	Novice * Pre-Championship * Championship

Dancers competing in the <u>syllabus level events</u> are only allowed to dance figures at the level or below which they are dancing. For example, a couple competing at Silver level may only dance Silver and Bronze figures. You can see the allowed figures in the <u>Syllabus section</u> of the national website, <u>www.usadance.org</u>.

Dancers competing in <u>open level events</u> may dance figures from any syllabus level, as well as innovative variations, as long as these moves comply with the rules and regulations of USA Dance.

Who can compete in a Dance Competition?

At the Phoenix USA Dancesport Challenge, ALL PARTICIPANTS MUST BE ACTIVE USA DANCE MEMBERS. You may apply for membership via <u>www.usadance.org</u> or contact the Phoenix Chapter at <u>www.phoenixusadance.org</u>. Details for membership signup may be found with the registration forms.

What are the events?

Phoenix DanceSport Challenge offers events in the following styles of dance:

International Style: Standard - Waltz, Tango, Viennese Waltz, Slow Foxtrot, Quickstep Latin – Samba, Cha Cha, Rumba, Paso Doble, Jive

<u>American Style</u>: Smooth - Waltz, Tango, Foxtrot, Viennese Waltz Rhythm - Cha Cha, Rumba, East Coast Swing, Bolero, Mambo

<u>Social:</u> Bachata, Salsa, Merengue, Hustle, Nightclub Twostep, West Coast Swing

What are the music lengths per routine?

Typically 90-110 seconds, except for Viennese Waltz and Jive, which are 60-90 seconds.

How are the events judged?

During the events, three to five judges will rank the couples based on their technical skills, presentation, and showmanship. Scores from all the judges are combined to obtain the final standings. Adjudication is both an objective and subjective process, and that is why several judges are used to ensure fairness.

How do you support your favorite dancers as an audience member?

During the competition, you will be seeing some lovely and inspiring dancing. Applause is much appreciated anytime during the event. So don't be afraid to applaud, cheer, and call out the number(s) of your favorites. Make yourself a part of the fun and excitement of the Phoenix DanceSport Challenge!

SPECTATOR TICKETS

General admission may be purchased at the door on the day of the event. Seating is on a first-come, first-serve basis. We encourage the public to support our competitors and help make the Phoenix DanceSport Challenge a success.

- General admission price is \$10.00 for 12 and up. 11 & under free. CASH Preferred.
- Parents or caretakers of juvenile competitors, as well as coaches, will be expected to purchase a spectator ticket.

RULES AND GUIDELINES

Per a new USA Dance National directive – ALL COMPETITORS MUST BE ACTIVE USA DANCE MEMBERS (social or competitive level) in order to participate. Membership is available online at <u>www.usadance.org</u> or contact the Phoenix Chapter for information. Details are available with the registration forms.

The rules and guidelines listed in the following paragraphs are <u>not</u> a complete description of all applicable USA Dance rules. The current rulebook is available on the National USA Dance website at <u>www.usadance.org.</u>

For safety and liability constraints, the following rules are in addition to current USA Dance rules: you must have a foot on the floor at all times, no lifts, slashes or slides. These rules will be adhered to for this competition or you will be disqualified.

Food and sealed beverage containers may be taken into the ballroom and we ask that you are careful to avoid spillage. Should one occur, please alert the organizers immediately so that it can be cleaned up to avoid floor damage and to avoid it becoming a hazard to competitors and spectators.

ENTRIES

Each couple must fill out an entry form, including both partners' names and signatures. A parent or legal guardian must sign for competitors under the age of 18. Competitors dancing with more than one partner should fill out a separate entry form for each partnership and submit them together to ensure no conflicting entries.

All competitors certify by signing the entry form that they are eligible under USA Dance guidelines to compete in the events and age groups they have marked on the entry form, and that they will comply with all costuming and syllabus rules applicable to the events they have entered. Signature also denotes a release from liability for injury, theft or any mishap towards the ASU West facility, the City of Glendale or the Phoenix USA Dance Chapter.

<u>Events will be run in the following age categories</u>: 1) Pre-Teen / Junior / Youth combined, 2) Adult, and 3) all Senior categories combined. However, depending upon scheduling needs, the organizers reserve the right to combine/cancel events or add/delete categories due to number of entries.

The social dance events are available to three age categories (18 and under / 19 to 34 / 35 and above - both partners must meet age requirement), **with no skill level restriction.** Costuming is allowed, and street clothes are acceptable. "Good taste" criteria will remain in force at the judges' and committee's discretion. Social categories will be limited to the <u>first 25 couples</u> (per dance) who enter. One age level per dance per partnership will be allowed.

Entry deadline is Saturday, February 27, 2016. Late entries are subject to the Registrar's approval and will be charged a late fee. Please contact registrar **Sue Eldred** at (602-550-0944) **or email:** <u>comp@phoenixusadance.org</u>. <u>A late fee of \$15 per person will be assessed for approved registration / entries postmarked or received electronically after the deadline date of February 27th. A late fee of \$15 will be assessed for any payments received after March 5th.</u>

CHECK IN

All competitors MUST report to the Registration Table, and present a valid identification and <u>active USA Dance Card</u> in order to pick up packets and numbers. <u>Competitors should be in the ballroom, ready to dance at least 30 minutes prior to</u> the scheduled time for their events. Competitors must check in with the Deck Captain prior to their heat. Any competitor who does not take the floor when called will face disqualification from that heat. Upcoming heats (including callbacks) will be posted near the on-deck area.

PROFICIENCY CLASSIFICATIONS

Competitors may enter a proficiency level for which both partners are eligible to dance, as well as the next higher level, except that: They may not compete in more than two consecutive proficiency level classifications in a particular style.

AGE CATEGORIES

Couples may compete in the age category for which they are both eligible. Age is determined by birth year, regardless of when your birthday occurs. <u>Competitors may not compete in more than two consecutive age categories</u> in a particular style.

SYLLABUS RESTRICTIONS

Syllabus steps may be from the USA Dance, NDCA, or WDSF, ISDT or other published syllabus, such as DVIDA, Fred Astaire, or Arthur Murray. Couples dancing steps above their entered syllabus level will be warned, and continued violation could result in disqualification. If you are not sure what syllabus level your routines match, please have your coach check them against one of the published syllabi, or enter Novice level since it does not have any restrictions.

COSTUME RESTRICTIONS

Please refer to the costume restrictions in the USA Dance Rulebook, Section 3.11. Competitors, coaches, and parents must be responsible for ensuring that dancers are dressed in accordance with the rules. If you are unsure about an outfit, bring practice wear as a back-up. *Rhinestone costumes are not allowed in syllabus categories, except in Senior age divisions.* Competitors who fail to comply with the rules will be allowed to dance, but will not be judged. The rulebook may be downloaded from the National USA Dance website at **www.usadance.org**.

VIDEOTAPING AND PHOTOGRAPHY

USA Dance allows personal videotaping and photography, as long as it does not interfere with the competitors or the viewing pleasure of spectators. Video camera operators will be asked to utilize an assigned area and are not be allowed on the competition floor. Camera operators, please respect other spectators' viewing space and <u>do not</u> interfere with the judges, other officials or competitors in any way. No flash photography may be used (except by designated personnel for purpose of chapter archiving) for the safety of the dancers.

Photographers will be taking photos throughout the event. Your registration signature grants permission for the USA Dance Chapter and/or Devil Dancesport to use any images captured of you for marketing, advertising, and other business related purposes.

Important Information for All Competitors

NEW USA DANCE MEMBERSHIP Requirement for Participation:

Per a directive from USA Dance National - a minimum of Social Membership (\$35), Student/Collegiate Athlete Membership (\$25), or Youth/Juvenile Membership (\$10) is a pre-requisite for participation in this year's Phoenix Dancesport Challenge.

Any active membership level (social, collegiate or dancesport athlete) will allow entry into all categories offered at this non-sanctioned event.

Membership must be ACTIVE prior to the date of competition.

NEW SCHOLARSHIP Fee for 2016:

A \$5.00 entry fee per person will be collected for each scholarship heat entered. Each partnership may only enter ONE age category of Scholarship per dance style (Rhythm, Latin, Smooth, Standard).

SOCIAL DANCE CRITERIA for 2016:

Each partnership may enter only ONE age category per social dance style.

CANCELLATION POLICY:

- 100% refund if cancellation received before Saturday, March 5th.
- 50% refund if cancellation received between March 5th and March 11th.
- No refund if cancellation received on or after Saturday, March 12th

You may enter as many of the social dance categories as you desire (pending open slots). Each partnership may only enter ONE age category per dance style.

Both dancers MUST meet the criteria for the chosen age category.

If a partnership mixes age categories, the following rules apply:

- For 19 and over, the age of the younger partner will dictate category placement.
- If one partner is under 18 and the other 19 or older, the age of the older partner will dictate category placement.

Examples:

- 1. One partner is 17, the other partner is 20. The couple must enter the older age category (19 to 34).
- 2. One partner is 33, the other partner is 52. The couple must enter the younger age category.
- 3. A couple fits the Senior age category. They choose to dance in the Adult age bracket for specific dances. They may do so, but cannot enter the Senior age category for those same dances.
