A Vacation Worth Remembering

Last week Hubert and I spent the week in Las Vegas and didn't loose a dime. However, we did come back far richer than when we left without gambling even that dime. We again attended the Dance Vision Las Vegas Dance Camp.

The Camp is designed to help any dancer, whether beginner, intermediate, advanced, or Instructor, brush up and improve their dancing. It is easy to get inspired in classes taught by former (now retired from competition) champions such as Jim and Jenell Maranto; Michael Mead and Toni Redpath; Don Johnson and Kasha Kozak; Toby and Harmony Monroe, just to mention a few. The classes cover the major smooth, standard, rhythm, and Latin dances as well as some less common such as Night Club Two Step, Bachata, and Argentine Tango. Students who wish can even learn a dance routine (this year Tango and Cha Cha were the routines) to perform on the final evening.

Concurrent classes are conducted for the different level of dancers. Dancers are encouraged to attend whichever classes challenge them — without becoming frustrating. We attended mostly the Instructor classes, but one morning featured Argentine Tango (not our favorite) so we detoured to a Bronze Salsa Class that proved fun and enlightening.

There is so much information offered at the camp that a DVD is available to those who attend that contains all the figures taught at the camp.

Consider spending a little vacation time in June next year giving your dancing a concentrated boost – and that may be the only sure bet in Las Vegas!

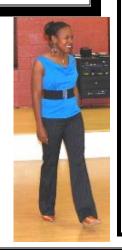
