Create the Environment

Many of us watch *Dancing With the Stars*. One of the things that I enjoy most is the creativity of the attire worn by the performers. True, many of the outfits seem to be designed to entice members of the opposite sex - who have little or no interest in dancing - to watch the show. However, the more "noble" purpose is to help create the dance atmosphere and environment – to enhance the emotion of the dance and expression thereof.

Good dancing requires an investment of emotion. What we wrap ourselves in – our attire can significantly affect the way we dance. A friend recently said "You always dance better when you know people are watching."
