
Where has the summer gone? We have a lot to reflect on for the past couple of months. The USA Dance Tri-Cities Chapter has been busy!



Rememberíng Renee Stephan

March 25, 1929 - August 1, 2014

Thoughts from Sharon Dunn & Ruth Wilbourne

On August 1, 2014 we were extremely saddened to hear about the loss of Renee Stephan. She was a long time friend and dancer, truly a beautiful person inside and out. I have received a lot of expressions of sympathy from our Chapter. Everyone had so many kind things to say about Renee. She was a person that gave unreservedly from her heart and warmed a room with her presence. I would like to share with you thoughts from Ruth Wilbourne, a long time friend of Renee's:

"Renee and I met in 1999 when I joined USA Dance Tri-Cities Chapter 6060. Over the years, we became good friends, talking at least once a week by phone, and on the second Saturday of the month, my husband Bill and I would meet Renee at a restaurant for a get-together prior to going to our chapter dance. If I were later calling her than usual, she would call me and say, "haven't heard from you, and wondered if something was wrong". That was Renee, always concerned for others.

She loved ballroom dancing and talked about it to everyone she met, encouraging them to attend our chapter dances, and if they had a good time, encouraged them to join. Many became members after talking with Renee. She served on the Chapter's Board of Directors for eight years, and worked at the admissions table, greeting everyone with a warm welcome.

When our chapter dances were held at a studio, she would volunteer to come on the day after Thanksgiving and help decorate for the holidays. She would say, "I can't do much, but I'll do what I can". Always a volunteer and willing to help - that was Renee.

Renee loved volunteering at the Thomas Johns Cancer Hospital, greeting patients, family members and interacting with the staff. She also spent many hours swimming at the YMCA pool, early in the morning too, because she would be able to swim before a lot of people came. She loved her "volunteer and Y families".

Late last Fall she and I were talking about decorating and she asked me what colors were in our house, I told her, and lo and behold, a few weeks later, she presented Bill and I with a wedding present of a beautiful afghan she had crocheted. The colors matched our décor perfectly.

When Bill and I were at The Homestead last fall, I saw some chairs in the Great Hall were upholstered in fabric that had dragonflies in the pattern. Knowing how much Renee liked dragonflies, I took a picture of one of the chairs and emailed it to her. She just thought that was wonderful. She was so appreciative of anything that you did for her.

Renee now dances in heaven. I already miss our weekly chats and her friendly smile".

Thoughts from the editor

I had the good fortune of knowing Renee through both her volunteer work at The Thomas Johns Cancer Center, and through dance. We met in 1998 when she first began dancing. The first time I saw her in the hospital, we were both surprised to see each other, and there were big hugs. Our friendship was special because we shared two passions in our lives – dancing and the care of those in the hospital. If I hadn't seen her at work for a while, she would say, "Ginny – I haven't seen you in a while. I hope everything is OK with the kids and your mother!" As mentioned so many times at her Memorial Service, Renee was a caring, compassionate woman.











You know that description of someone who would give you the shirt off their back? It shouldn't surprise you that Renee was one of those people. When one of my daughters was in high school, she needed a

special camera for a photography course. We shopped all over and couldn't find the one she wanted. I was talking to Renee about our unsuccessful afternoon at a dance and she said, "I have one of those cameras and I'd be happy to give it to her! It's just sitting in the closet." Well, it took some haggling to convince her I would PAY her for the camera, but I did succeed eventually. I asked my daughter, now 33, if she still has the camera, and she assured me it is one she will always keep.

As many of you know, Renee was an early riser. We roomed together one year at the Tidewater Chapter New Years weekend event in Norfolk. Since we partied some after the dance, bedtime was 2am and I was looking forward to

sleeping in the next morning. Around 6am I heard Renee stirring around and I growled something like, "Renee, why are you up so early? We can sleep





late!" Her response- "I did sleep late. I usually get up at 4am." I dove under the covers and awoke a couple hours later to find Renee standing there with 2 cups of hot coffee and a muffin. All was forgiven.

As recently as last December, Renee's compassion was evident when she was admitted to the same facility where my 98 year old mother resides, for rehabilitation/physical therapy. Renee kept an eye on Mom and reported to me every day when I came to visit. She even sent a message to me on New Years Eve, through Ruth Wilbourne, to say that Mom was doing fine.

I'll miss that smiling face, but I know she's brightening someone else's day where she now lives. Bless you Renee for being a part of my life.

LOD: Tell us about yourself. Where were you born and where, besides Richmond, have you lived?

I am originally from Guatemala which is located in Central America and borders West with Mexico. My family consisted of my parents Roger and Emma, my younger sister Emma Lucrecia and my brother Luis Fernando. I am the very proud mother of three, Jose Luis (29), Geril Paola (26), and Juan Manuel (21). We came to the US in the cold month of February, 19 years ago. We had no winter clothes as we don't have snow in our country. We lived with my brother- in- law Luis and wife Sonia in Mechanicsville for a couple of months. I came with \$100 in my pocket and 3 kids. My ex-husband had \$25.00 when he came a month before us. We didn't speak the language nor did we know how to drive. I didn't even know how to use the washer and dryer. The first time I used it, I shrank the clothes!! The pants now looked like capris and the socks had shrunk to fit a baby. I learned how to use the vacuum at my first job at McDonalds. I got bathed in milkshakes, orange juice, ketchup, mustard while taking the trash bags to the containers outside. My kids thought I had the greatest job in the world!

A couple of months later, my ex-husband got his driver license and we moved to the West End of Richmond so our kids could attend a school where English as a second language was taught. He worked in the mornings and I worked at nights at the Hyatt Hotel off Broad Street. I worked in restaurants, at banquets and provided room service. I learned a lot while I was there and met a lot of good people. A couple of years later I got a job at a call center for Circuit City Stores off Staples Mill Road. I started in the Customer Service Center and advanced to Payroll. I had the chance to work abroad for three months and went to India. On the way back I spent time in Paris where I was dying to eat a steak!!! There is no meat in India because cows are sacred. It's a good place to start a vegetarian diet.

Upon my return to the US, I was laid off so I took time off and went with my kids to spend time with my parents in Guatemala. When I returned to the US I got a job at Chesterfield County in the payroll department. I was offered an opportunity to belong to the Diversity Team where I coordinated the first Latino Heritage Month for the County. Our events included a lot of food from local restaurants, vendors, music, and dancing. Later, I decided I wanted to have more time with my kids since they were almost ready to start college, and I got a job in Payroll with the Virginia Retirement System. I now work in Payroll for AECOM, a global Fortune 500 Company.

LOD: Are you involved in community service?

Being in a new country, learning a new language, and adapting to the culture was quite a shock, but nothing compares to how to file your taxes!! My brother- in-law invited me to a "Tax Free Service for the Community", which helped people complete their paper tax forms. At the time I had no idea what they were doing, but I soon learned and for the next five years worked as a Volunteer Tax Payer. I got my certification from VITA-IRS and my work for them was a rewarding experience that allowed me to give back to the community.

LOD: Is there something most people don't know about you?

In Guatemala, I graduated as Valedictorian of my high school class of 240. I studied four years at Francisco Marroquin University and attained a Bachelor in Education degree with a minor in Computer Science. I taught elementary school to high school students. After all this education, I still didn't know how to use a vacuum or a microwave!

LOD: How long have you been dancing and what prompted you to start?

I have been dancing since my early teens. I am Latina and dancing is in my blood. I participated in dancing events starting with elementary school. My parents were great dancers, as were the rest of my family. All family gatherings ended with dancing.

LOD: When did you begin ballroom dancing? Where did you first dance ballroom?

I started taking ballroom group classes almost two years ago at Rigby's Jig. A receptionist there suggested I start with introductory group classes, which I did, and I've been taking classes and attending parties ever since. I am hooked for life.

LOD: What are your favorite dances?

My first choice is Salsa. It's the music and dancing that I grew up with and that I have great memories of dancing. My second choices would be Rumba, Waltz and Night Club Two Step, which have similar moves with the Latin Bolero. Last but not least, the Hustle, Tango and West Coast Swing, which are still a challenge for me.

LOD: Have you taken private or group lessons?

I have been taking group classes only. I had never learned the technique, not even for Salsa. It is important for me to learn the basics; the hold, poise, balance, footwork, turns and the vocabulary. I confess that most of the time I didn't understand what was meant when the instructor said inside turn, outside turn, cross body lead, chasse, spiral turn, back ochos, promenade, closed and open positions. I learned by watching, practicing and memorizing the steps and the moves. I'll work on the vocabulary later!

One advantage of group classes is that I get the chance to practice with different dancers. Most of the advanced dancers are willing to give you positive feedback and teach you how to do the dance steps at your level. The disadvantage is that sometimes there are not enough gentlemen in the group sessions.

LOD: Are you concentrating on any particular dances? Which ones?

Not at this time. I want to learn as many dances as time permits and then make my choice to excel in one. I have taken Night Club Two- Step, Rumba, Waltz, Shag, Foxtrot, Argentine Tango, Viennese Waltz, Salsa, Hustle, East Coast Swing, Country Two-Step, and Cha-Cha and I still can't decide which one I like the most.

LOD: What is the best dance experience you've ever had?

Dancing the waltz with my Dad at my sweet sixteen birthday party.

LOD: What are your dance goals?

To learn the vocabulary!! I need to learn the names and then link them to the steps. Also, I hope one day to learn more technique, but I don't want to lose the art of dancing.

LOD: If you could dance with any celebrity dancer who would it be and what dance?

I would choose JR Martinez, the winner of the13th season of "Dancing with the Stars". I would love to dance a rumba or waltz with him. His dedication, passion, hard work and determination earned my respect.

LOD: Thank you for sharing your life with us.

Likewise Shirlene, the pleasure is mine. Thank you to LOD for allowing me to share with your readers a little bit of my life and my dancing.
