equipment needed for comfortable, skillful dancing on the dance floor. Some folks are in need of help obtaining dance shoes, and some



Dancing and Dining at Callahan's



An Evening at CALLAHAN'S MOUNTAIN LODGE

Callahan's, a Southern Oregon landmark founded in 1947, was destroyed by fire on September 2, 2006. Graced with its unique mountainside setting and ambiance, Callahan's had been welcoming guests for more than sixty years. Inspired by the overwhelming support of the community, owners Donna and Ron Bergquist decided to rebuild the historic structure.

Purchasing the restaurant from the Callahan family in 1996, they transformed the lodge into a small destination resort with the addition of 12 guest rooms, six with luxury appointments. Their plans to add more rooms, however, were interrupted by the fire.


Ron Bergquist's career in architectural design and the management of such facilities employed his expertise in the design and development of the new lodge and restaurant. Having designed and founded Shari's Restaurant chain, as well as developing the Rogue Regency Inn in Medford, Ron's experience suited the task well. "Our primary goal," he says, "was to incorporate into the new design as much of the ambience and charm of the old lodge as possible. The design of the new lobby and dining rooms is practically identical to that which greeted guests before."

The new four-floor facility, designed with solar and other energy-saving features, offers nineteen luxury guest rooms. In-room features include spa tubs, outdoor decks and wood-burning fireplaces. The restaurant offers casual fine dining with breakfast, lunch and dinner service year-round and an expansive outdoor dining deck.

For their own appreciation of having a place to dance to live music, Ron and Donna added a small

dance floor to the former restaurant. "We recognized that there is no place in the region for those who enjoy dancing to go to for a nice dinner and to dance." The ballroom of the new lodge accommodates a 21' x 24' oak dance floor with seating for dining on the perimeter. Western red cedar wall paneling and stone wood-burning fireplace contribute to the comfortable upscale space where dining and dancing pair well.

Following the successful March "Evening at Callahan's" dinner dance, with the encouragement of Rush Behnke, president of Southern Oregon



Chapter of USA Dance, and his wife, Tara, the Bergquists became members of SO Dance. "Our goal is to build a standing for Callahan's Lodge as a place where the community can meet to enjoy a dance-enhanced dining experience." Live music is performed nightly by

soloists on piano and acoustic guitar in the main dining room from 6 until 9 pm, but the expanded ballroom setting and dance floor is a better complement for dancers who appreciate more space and an event specifically planned for social dancing.

The "Evening at Callahan's," featuring the Alan Berman Trio, extends the opportunity for dancers to enjoy this special mountainside setting and hospitality. A generous buffet with chef-carved Prime Rib, Tuscan Chicken Roulade and Pasta Primavera includes coffee, tea and dessert. The event is held on the second Friday of each month, serving dinner from 6:30-7:30, with ballroom dancing from 7:30 until 10 pm, for \$38.50 per person including gratuity. For guests who wish to secure lodging that evening, a 20% reduction on the room rate is applied. Reservations for the next event on Friday, April 10, can be arranged by calling 541-482-1299.
