

## WORD FROM YOUR PRESIDENT, RUSH BEHNKE

Hello Fellow Dancers,

Dancing with the Rogue Valley Stars is just a week away, and we need your help to make this event a success. Please be supportive of this venue as it will bring a lot of muchneeded dollars to our dance scholarship fund. November 14<sup>th</sup> -- See you there!



Dancing with the Stars (the TV series) has brought renewed interest in dancing. I know the economy is affecting a lot of us (me included). This wonderful, worthy event is just \$10 per person, and it will give back joy and needed funds for many years.

Some of you may be wondering how the dance instructors chose their partners for the "stars". The instructors' choices were largely based on students being active in performance classes and doing well. They were also looking for good match-ups in personalities and dance ability. Sparrow Clubs, Southern Oregon will receive two-thirds of the net proceeds for this event and if you knew what they do, you would

**cry**. The other one-third of net proceeds will be for local dance scholarships through the USA Dance 1011 (SO Dance) scholarship program.



Sparrow Clubs is "Kids helping kids in medical need", although it may sound impossible for most kids. With Sparrow Clubs it becomes possible for every child to help.

Sparrow Clubs is helping to raise a generation of kids who can direct their compassion for medically challenged kids, to actually doing something. With Sparrow Clubs, kids, no matter what their parent's income, can do community service to raise money for kids and parents who need help. In fact they earn \$10 in "Sparrow cash" for every hour they do community service. The "Sparrow cash" comes from businesses and service clubs who make it available. It doesn't get much better than this; helping kids to feel better about themselves, through selfless acts for others needs.

The Jazz Jubilee board of directors felt the all new "Dance Venue" at the Medford armory was a huge success. They are already talking about how they can improve the venue for next year. Many of you were dance hosts and Esther Freeman organized the USA Dance ball gown rental program, which was a big hit. The dance floor was generous in size and the music and cost was right.


